NB Rule 34 (10) Withdrawals

In the case of withdrawal from heats, semi-finals or finals in swimming, diving or synchronised swimming events at any Scottish Championships, the competitor or club shall pay without any excuse (except in the case of genuine illness or proven emergency) such sum as may be determined by Council and confirmed by the A.G.M.

Any competitor withdrawing from a final in such a manner as to prevent a reserve taking part (except as stated above) shall be suspended immediately from all further events at that Championship.

3 RESERVES

They should report to the Recorder in plenty of time prior to the event. If accepted, they will be allocated to the slowest available empty lane.

4 PRESENTATIONS OF MEDALS

These will take place after the following event to the first three placed in each event. Recipients should assemble "appropriately dressed" in Club gear at the presentation assembly area. Anyone not present at the correct time will risk not receiving their medal.

5 WARM UPS
