I That this branch of the Scottish amateur Swimming association shall be called the Western Counties amateur Swimming association hereinafter called the Western Counties, and Shall consist of such cluts as subscribe to the funds and abide by the Constitution and Rules, of the Said Western Counties.

2. To enforce the observance of the Laws and Rules of the S. a. S. a., and to deal. with any infringement thereof, f. To stimulate public opinion in favour of providing proper accommodation and facilities for acquiring and practising the art of swimming.

9. To endeavour to get a uniformity of.

bath construction, with proper conveniences for spectators witnessing entertainments. MB. - The Rules and Laws of the Western Counties. apply to persons of either sex, whether so Stated or not.

4. Membership shall be open to any Amateur Swimming Club, or any recognised Athletic or other Club having an Amateur Swimming Section, or engaged in fostering the Art of Swimming, which has its headquarters within the bounds specified in Rule 2 hereof.

5. Any club willing to join the Western Counties shall apply in writing (enclosing a copy of their Rules for approval) to the Secretary of the Western Counties, the application to be considered at the first ordinary meeting thereafter, when, if proposed and seconded by delegates belonging to different clubs, and carried by a majority of delegates present and voting, the club shall be admitted to membership. membership.

6. The Annual Subscription shall be Fifteen Shillings (15/-); Ladies' Club, Seven Shillings and Sixpence (7/6), for clubs within a radius of five miles from Royal Exchange; Country Clubs, Seven Shillings and Sixpence (7/6), and to become due at Annual Meeting in February. If not paid on or before 31st May, clubs will be liable to suspension.

7. The Annual General Meeting shall be held on the third Tuesday of February in each year (to which each affiliated club is entitled to send three delegates), when Reports will be submitted, Office-Bearers for the ensuing year appointed, and any other competent business transacted.

8. The Office-Bearers shall consist of President,

8. The Office-Bearers shall consist of President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, Minute Secretary, Trustee, and Handicapper. All offices to be Honorary (excepting that of Handicapper).

9. The duties of the President shall be to preside at all meetings of the General Committee, and sign the minutes when confirmed; in the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall perform his duties; and failing either, a Chairman may be appointed from the delegates present.

10. The Treasurer shall receive all moneys payable to the General Committee, and disburse the same as they may direct; keep an account of the same, and produce any balance he may have when called upon. He shall submit a monthly statement to the General Committee, and prepare an Annual Report

11. The Secretary shall conduct the correspond-

ence. He shall prepare the Annual Report of the Western Counties, and send a Copy of the same to each Deleate at least 7 days before the Annual Meeting.

12. The Secretary may call a Special Meeting of the Committee or of the Western Counties whenever he thinks the business to be brought before it is of sufficient importance. A Special Meeting of the Committee or of the Western Counties shall also be called by the Secretary within 14 days of the receipt by him of a written requisition signed by twenty clubs, accompanied by a fee of 20/- and stating the reason for which such a Meeting is to be called. (The fee may be returned).

13. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep a book, to be called the "Reference Book," in which shall be enrolled the names of all such persons who have been suspended for violation of any of the Western Counties Laws of Swimming, or have acted dishonestly towards any of the affiliated clubs.

14 The Minute Secretary shall take the minutes of all General Committee and Annual Meetings, and send the notice calling same to each delegate.

15. The duties of Trustee shall be to keep in safe custody all the trophies belonging to the Western Counties. He shall from time to time deliver trophies, etc., to clubs and competitors winning same as per Rule 7, Page 23. On resigning he shall hand over any trophies in his possession or securities provided under Rule 7, Page 23, as the General Committee may direct. Committee may direct.

15. The Business of the Western Counties shall be managed by three representatives, elected by and from the members of each club composing said Western Counties. This General Committee to meet for the transaction of business on the first Tucsday of each month from March to December inclusive, and on the last Tucsday of January, each evening at 8 o'clock. President and Secretary shall be members of all standing committees ex-officio.

18. All meetings of the General Committee shall

18. All meetings of the General Committee shall be open to members of affiliated clubs, but the duly appointed delegates shall alone have the power of voting and speaking. When a delegate cannot attend a substitute may be appointed, but he must have the written authority from his club.

19. Any individual or unaffiliated club wishing to hold an Aquatic Entertainment under the Rules of the S.A.S.A. shall apply in writing to the Secretary of the Western Counties, the request to be accompanied by a fee of £1 1/-, which sum, or a

less sum (at the discretion of the General Committee), may be retained if permit be granted. The Western Counties reserve the right to appoint all Officials.

29. Any member of an affiliated club competing in an Open Swimming Entertainment not held under the Rules as defined by the S.A.S.A. and Western Counties, shall be disqualified from all Open Competitions for a period to be determined by the General Committee. The Handicapper shall report the names of competitors entering for any Open Races under the auspices of the Western Counties whom he knows to have infringed the Bye-Laws.

21. The General Committee shall bring before the notice of the Royal Humane Society any act of gallant conduct performed by any of the members of affiliated clubs, and endeavour to obtain that Society's medal and certificate.

22. At the December meeting of the General Committee two delegates—not Office-Bearers—shall be appointed as Auditors.

23. All books and papers of clubs affiliated to Western Counties shall be open for inspection to any Sub-Committee appointed by the Western Counties for such purpose.

24. Suspension.—If at any meeting of the General Committee a resolution be passed by the votes of two-thirds of those present and voting, to the effect that a club has rendered itself unworthy to belong to the Western Counties, such club shall

be suspended; but notice of such resolution must be previously inserted in the agenda paper for that meeting.

25. All Open Handicaps held under S.A.S.A. and W.C.A.S.A. Rules to be handicapped by the Official Handicapper, whose fee shall be 10/, which must be paid within fourteen days after Gala. The list of competitors for handicapping must be in the hands of the Handicapper for three clear days before the competition takes place and may be retained by him for one day. The Handicapper shall give a Report at Annual Meeting of number of Galas held, Competitors entered, and number and Clubs of Prize-winners, etc.

26. No swimmer can represent as a competitor more than one club in any one year, which shall date from 1st January to 31st December, unless under S.A.S.A. Rule 34.

27. Any swimmer not a member of an affiliated Swimming or other recognised Amateur Athletic Association shall be debarred from competing in a race held under S.A.S.A. and Western Counties

Rules.

28. Hon. Subscribers.—The Western Counties may elect Hon. Patrons who have contributed to the funds of the Western Counties; they may also appoint Hon. Members who have rendered services to the Western Counties or to the art of swimming. The fee for Life Membership to be five guineas. All Hon. Members and Life Members, whether Delegates from their Clubs or not, to have

# DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP RULES.

- That all Championships shall be held, managed, and controlled by the Western Counties, and the venue of Competition changed each year to the best advantage of the art and representation of the title.
- 2. The winner's name shall be engraved on the Cup, Trophy, or Medal, at the expense of the Western Counties.
- 3. All Championships in the possession of the Western Counties shall be offered each year to all Clubs affiliated to the Western Counties on or before 1st May; but the Western Counties do not bind themselves to accept the highest or any offer.
- 4. All offers for Championships must be enclosed in a scaled envelope, marked outside "Offer for Championship," and addressed to the Secretary of the Western Counties. When offering for more than one Championship, each offer should be made on separate sheets of paper, stating which is to take precedence. In all offers the amount over the value of the Medals (£3) should be clearly stated.
- 5. That the accepted Club shall receive the Entry Money, which is fixed at 2/6.

- 6. That the Western Counties shall appoint all offiicals. Any Official unable to attend must give immediate notice to the Secretary, who shall be empowered to fill up the vacancy. Judges in points Competitions shall hand their papers to the Referce, who shall at once forward them to the Secretary of the Western Counties for reference.
- 7. That a winner of a Championship Trophy shall be entitled to receive and hold the same from the time of his giving satisfactory security to the Trustee, either by deposit of money or otherwise, until one month prior to the date fixed for the next Competition, or until requested in writing to return it by the authority of the Trustee. In the event of a Championship being withheld or not taken up, the holder shall return the cup or trophy.
- Entries to be made with the Secretary of the Western Counties seven days before Competition, and accompanied by Entry Fee of 2/6.
- 2. That in all Championships where heats are necessary on any day previous to day of race, the holder is entitled to a place in the final without swimming in the heats. In the event of more than four teams entering for the Team Championship the Secretary may divide the competition into two heats and final.
- 10. That any Club which is granted a Championship must deposit with the Treasurer of the Western Counties the value of Medals not later than 30 days before date of Championship. The Wes-

tern Counties to forward the Medals to the offering Club one week before date of Championship, and in the event of any of the Medals not being required, said Medals to be returned to the Western Counties, and their value refunded.

- 11. It shall be the duty of the General Committee, at a meeting in June of each year, to allocate the different Championships for current year.

(a) Position on Platform.—Body erect, arms close by the sides, palms of hands facing backwards, heels and toes together. The arms at no part of the Dive to be brought behind the body.

(b) Take Off.—A forward and upward movement is taken and simultaneously with the feet leav-ing the platform the arms are brought smartly in front of the head and the thumbs approxi-mated.

- (c) Position in Mid Air.—Arms extended in front of head, thumbs in contact, and the palms facing downwards and backwards. The lower limbs to be in close contact, and the feet fully extended. Upper limbs, trunk, and lower limbs to be in one straight line.
- (d) Entrance to Water.—Position of body to be as in (c), and at such an angle to the water as to ensure a minimum splash.
- (e) RETURN TO SURFACE.—The angle and relative position of the body on returning to be as nearly as possible that of entry. When the tips of the fingers reach the surface the hands to be flexed at the wrist and slid along the sur-face of the water.
- (f) Motion of Leaving the Surface.—Simultaneously with the ducking of the head and shoulders the lower limbs leave the surface of the water extended at the knees, but with the feet flexed at the ankle, and disappear again perpendicular to the surface and with the feet fully extended. Competitors may or may not touch the bottom.
- (g) RETURN TO SURFACE.—The point of return to be in line with the direction taken upon leaving the surface, but to be at least three yards in advance of the point of entry. Position and movements of the upper limbs to be as in (c).

#### OFFICIALS AND JUDGING.

6. The Judges, two in number, to be appointed by the General Committee of the Western Counties, Their separate awards arrived at independently to be added together and the competitors with the highest aggregates to be adjudged the winners. The decision of the Judges to be made on a form provided by the Association, and to be in all cases final. In the event of a tie a single trial at each test to decide.

### WATER POLO CHALLENGE CUP CONDITIONS.

- 1. That the Cup shall be called the "Western Counties Challenge Cup."
- 2. The competitions for the Cup shall be annual, as follows:—A, Major Competition; B, Minor Competition; and shall be open to all the clubs and Private Baths affiliated to the Western Counties (except Ladies' Clubs).
- 3. All Clubs affiliated to Western Counties shall be included in Competition (except 16 Clubs exempted by Polo Committee).
- 4. The Clubs exempted and last sixteen in Minor Competition shall form competitors for Major Competition, and as soon as last sixteen of Minor Competition are known the first round of Major Competition shall be drawn, and succeeding rounds fortnightly thereafter. The club drawn first in ballot to have choice of bath, except in final tie.
- 5. The competing teams shall number seven players, each a bona-fide member; and, while a team may change its players, no individual shall play for more than one club throughout the ties.
- 6. No club shall receive more than one bye in the season.

- 7. The Water Polo Committee shall name dates on which ties shall be played.
- 8. The Final Tie shall be played in whatever neutral Bath the Water Polo Committee may determine.
- 9. In the event of any game resulting in a draw, the game to be replayed within eight days in the away club's bath, and in the event of a second draw, six minutes extra to be played.
- 10. Any club refusing or failing to play the club against which it has been drawn on the dates specified, shall be disqualified. Clubs unable to form a team for any tie shall at once advise Secretary of club drawn against, also Polo Convener, at least 24 hours before match.
- 11. Any club playing an ineligible player shall be disqualified.
- 12. The Convener of the Polo Committee shall intimate to each of the clubs drawn the name of the club they are to play, and the dates set apart for their tie. Three days' notice at least must be given of same.
- 13. Notice of the result of each game shall be sent by the Referee, so as to be in the hands of the Convener, within three days after the match has been played.
- 14. The Water Polo Committee shall have full power to appoint Referees and Goal Scorers for all Cup ties.

- 15. The Referee in all Cup ties must not be a member of either club, unless mutually arranged by competing clubs on night of tie, and in the Final tie, Referee and Goal Scorers must be members of neutral clubs.
- 16. It shall be the duty of the Home Club Committee to see that no spectators be allowed on the side of the Bath where the Referee stands.
- 17. If in the opinion of the Reference a player is guilty of deliberate rough play or misconduct, he shall be reported to the Convener of Polo Committee. The Polo Committee shall deal with such player as the circumstances of the case may warrant.
- 18. Captains of competing teams shall hand to the Referee and Captain of opposing team, previous to the game, the names of the players in their respective teams. The Referee shall forward list to the Convener of Polo, along with the result of the match, within three days thereafter.
- 19. On questions of interpretation of the Rules of Cup Competition, an appeal may be made to the Polo Committee of the Western Counties; but the Referee's decision must be acted upon during the game, although under protest. Appeals against the result of ties shall be made within one day, to Polo Convener, and be accompanied with a deposit of Five Shillings, which shall be retained if protest be frivolous.

WATER POLO LEAGUE RULES.

Kules Ek

1. This Competition shall be called the "WATER POLO LEAGUE." It may be divided into Divisions, and shall consist of Clubs affiliated to the Western Counties.

2. The objects of the League shall be to promote and extend the game of Water Polo.

3. This League shall be controlled by a Committee of three, to be elected by the Western Counties, and one delegate for each team entering the competition.

4. The Annual Subscription to the League shall be 5/- for First Division and 2/6 for other Divisions.

5. A competition shall be held, which shall consist of each Club playing home-and-home fixtures with every other Club in their Division of the League. Private Bath Clubs may, by mutual agreement, play their return fixtures in a Public Bath.

6. Clubs entering more than one Division must register their players separately. Registered First Division players shall not be allowed to take part in any other Division, and players in the other Divisions competing in three First League matches will be classed as First League players. The Committee shall have full power to object to any player

taking part in Second Division matches, and to classify him as a First League player. Any Club playing an ineligible player shall have one point deducted from their score, and if the match in which such violation of the Rule has resulted in a win for the offending Club, or a draw, the points thus obtained shall not be added to their score.

7. Captains of competing teams shall hand to the referee and captain of opposing team, previous to the game, the names of the players in their respective teams. The Referee shall forward list to the Convener of League, along with the result of the match, within three days thereafter.

8. That at the end of the competition, the teams scoring the highest number of points shall be declared the champion team of their Division of the League.

9. Averages for the championship shall be taken from wins and draws, to be counted as follows:— Two points for a win, one for a draw. In the event of two Clubs being equal in points, they shall play off for the championship.

10. All matches shall be played under the Rules of the Scottish Amateur Swimming Association.

11. All matches shall be arranged at a meeting convened prior to the start of the competition.

12. If, in the opinion of the Referee, a player is guilty of deliberate rough play or misconduct, he shall be reported to the Convener of Polo League

Committee. The Polo League Committee shall deal with such player as the circumstances of the case may warrant.

13. Any club not fulfilling a fixture shall be fined 2/6 for First Division, and 1/6 for other Divisions, for each offence. It shall be held as not fulfilling a fixture if less than six players take the water.

14. All matches must be started not later than 9.20 p.m., or at the discretion of the Referee whose decision shall be final.

15. On questions of interpretation of the Rules of the League, an appeal may be made to the League Committee of the Western Counties; but the Referee's decision must be acted upon during the game, although under protest. Appeals against the result of the matches shall be made, within one day, to Convener of League Committee, and be accompanied by a deposit of 2/6, which shall be retained if protest be frivolous.
