## To the Delegates of Clubs affiliated to the Western Counties Amateur Swimming Association.

GENTLEMEN,

I have much pleasure in submitting to you the Third Annual Report of the

Association.

Membership.—There are at present 65 Clubs in the Association, an increase of eight over last Two Clubs resigned membership during the year, and the following Clubs, who had either withdrawn from official swimming, or who had never been in any Association, were added:—Boys' Life Brigade, Burnbank Unitas, Coatbridge Co-operative, Cuninghame, Glasgow Foundry Boys, Glasgow North-Western District Good Templars, Gourock, Hamilton, Lanarkshire Tramways, Paisley Ferguslie, In addition to being instrumental in placing the foregoing Clubs on the roll, the Extension Committee communicated with a number of other Clubs, and an effort was made to get them to affiliate. The results of their work are very satisfactory.

The total number of Open Event Entries was 3,544 for 67 races, in addition to which there was an entry of 538 for Team Handicaps. There are 36 Clubs in the Prize List, including winners from Edinburgh and Leith. There were 27 Ladies' Handicaps with an entry of 530, and nine Clubs are in the Prize List. In forwarding his report the Handicapper states that he handicapped altogether 4,612 swimmers, which along with the figures given above constitute a record since the Association was formed. He considers we have had a very heavy, but satisfactory year, and he hopes the same friendly spirit between the Handicapper and Competitors, which existed during last season will long continue.

Important Events.—Prominent amongst the events of the Gala Season were the Hamilton Galas and the Springburn Charity Gala. The former was a rather large undertaking, and was run in connection with the opening of the Hamilton Baths in February, 1909, and in conjunction with the Gartsherrie A.S.C. They proved most successful, and to the Committee in charge thanks are due for the able manner in which they discharged the duties entrusted to them. The Springburn Gala was very successful, and as a result local charities benefited to the extent of over £18. Distinguished amateur swimmers visiting us were T. S. Battersby, of Southport, at the Eastern Club's Gala, on 15th October, and the Hyde Seal Polo Club at Galas of Eastern and Glasgow Amateurs Clubs on 4th and 5th June respectively.
