## NOTICES OF MOTIONS AND ALTERATIONS IN RULES.

J. K. SHEDDEN (Western Amateurs).

Bye-Law 7, page 111 of Handbook—Delete word "and" third line, and add after Championships, "and Water Polo Selection."

NEW BYE-LAW.—"The membership of Water Polo Selection Committee shall consist of two members and a Convener. It shall be their duty to attend as many of the principal Water Polo Matches as possible, and to select all Water Polo teams representing the Western Counties A.S.A. or any part thereof. The Committee shall receive the courtesy of admission to all Galas and Water Polo Matches within the bounds of the W.C.A.S.A. District."

NEW BYE-LAW.—"No application for a Polo Match between representative teams shall be considered unless the application be forwarded at least 21 days before the date of the Match. The fee for such Match shall be 10/6, and all applications shall be made direct to the Convener of the Committee having control of such competitions."

WATER POLO CHALLENGE CUP CONDITIONS.—Rule 10, page 112 of Handbook, add after word "tie," third line, "other than the final tie;" also add to rule, "Any club having qualified for the final, and failing to compete therein shall pay a penalty of £3 to the Western Counties Amateur Swimming Association."

In the event of the final tie resulting in a draw, venue to be changed and fresh offers taken. In the event of a second draw, extra time shall be played of three minutes each way."

NEW BYE-LAW TO WATER POLO LEAGUE RULES.—Delete Rule 3, substitute "The League shall be controlled by a Committee of five and Water Polo Committee *ex-officio*. Three to form a quorum."

NEW BYE-LAW.—"No application for a Polo Match between representative teams shall be considered unless the application be forwarded at least 21 days previous to the date of the Match. All applications shall be made direct to the Convener of the Committee having control of such competitions."

MOTION.—"That a special committee be appointed to investigate and report to the Monthly Meeting of the Western Counties Amateur Swimming Association on the present method of forwarding entries for Open Competitions and other matters relative thereto, and any recommendations they may make shall come into immediate operation if approved of by the majority of the delegates."

## ANNUAL REPORT.

### To the Delegates of Clubs affiliated to the Western Counties Amateur Swimming Association.

GENTLEMEN,

I have much pleasure in submitting to you the Fourth Annual Report of the Association.

**Membership.**—There at present 63 Clubs in the Association, a decrease of two as compared with last year. 7 Clubs resigned membership during the year, while in addition we lost Alloa through the formation of the Fife and Clackmannan District. The following Clubs, who had either withdrawn from official swimming, or who had never been in any Association, were added:—Clyde Rubber Works, Congregational Churches (Eastern Section), Lanarkshire Ladies' Guild (Hamilton), Paisley Y.M.C.A., Paisley Police, Socialists (Eastern Section), Saracen, and St. Andrews. In addition to being instrumental in placing the foregoing Clubs on the roll, the Extension Committee communicated with a number of other Clubs, and an effort was made to get them to affiliate. The results of their work are very satisfactory, and thanks are due Mr. W. A. Lawson (Western Amateurs), and his Committee for their services.



**Galas.**—The total number of entertainments held under W.C.A.S.A. auspices during the year was 69, a decrease from the previous year of 8. At 41 of these there were Open Handicaps. The following list shows the position of the various Clubs as regards Entries and Prizes :—

The total number of Open Event Entries was 3,041 for 55 races, in addition to which there was an entry of 350 for Team Handicaps. There are 38 Clubs in the Prize List, including winners from Leith and Newcastle. There were 17 Ladies' Handicaps, with an entry of 418, and five Clubs are in the Prize List. In forwarding his report, Mr. James Laird, our respected Handicapper, states that he considers we have had a very satisfactory year, although the entries in all classes show a considerable reduction from last year. Mr. Laird hopes the same friendly spirit between Handicapper and Competitors which existed during last season will continue.

**Important Events.**—Prominent amongst the events of the Gala Season were the Polo International against England, and the International Gala held jointly by the Kinning Park and Western Baths Clubs. The former took place in Hamilton Baths on the occasion of the Bent Colliery Club Gala. It was a matter for regret that the enterprise of the Bent Club in offering for this event was not rewarded with a much larger attendance. The same remark applies to the latter event which did not receive the public recognition it merited. The Anseremme Sport Club (Belgium), was the attraction there, and in a team race and polo match met a Scottish Select Team. The Springburn Charity Gala, as usual, proved very successful, and as a result local charities benefited to the extent of over £15. Distinguished amateur swimmers visiting us, in addition to the Anseremme Club, were F. E. Beaurepaire (Australia), T. S. Battersby (Wigan), and Henry Taylor (Chadderton), at the Gala of the Glasgow Amateurs Club, on 6th September, 1910, and the Northumberland A.S.C. at the Gala of the Victoria Baths Club, on 16th May, 1910.

**S.A.S.A. Championships.**—The following Scottish Championships were carried through in the Western District :—100 Yards by Western Amateurs; 220 Yards by Glasgow Y.M.C.A.; 880 Yards by Gourock; 200 Yards (Ladies) and Graceful Swimming by Kinning Park; and Team Race Championship by Western Baths.

Competitors from this District were very successful in the above, and also the other Championships, the following being winners :—440 Yards and 880 Yards, Joseph Greenlees (Thistle); 100 Yards, C. D. Risk (Victoria Baths); 220 Yards, A. McFarlane (Dolphin); 100 Yards and 200 Yards (Ladies), Dinah McKay (Kinning Park); Team Championship, Victoria Baths; Polo Championship, Paisley.

In addition the District is again honoured through Bellahouston Academy, Ibrox, winning the Schoolboys' Championship; and also in the fact that no less than 42 Badges out of a total of 47 were won by Western Counties Swimmers.



**S.A.S.A. Records.**—The following Records made by our swimmers have been passed by the S.A.S.A.:—300 Yards by Joseph Greenlees (Thistle), 3 mins. 52½ secs.; 50 Yards (Ladies), by Miss Dinah M'Kay (Kinning Park), 34½ secs.

**District Championships.**—There was only one Championship—the 100 Yards (Ladies)—which was not taken up, the others were carried through as per the undernoted table. There was a regrettable falling off in the number of entrants in comparison with former seasons, and this was most noticeable in the Team Race Events. This is greatly to be deplored, but it is to be hoped that in the coming season more interest will be taken in the Championships, and that an increased entry may result.

**Inter-District Polo.**—Matches were played *versus* Eastern Counties at the West of Scotland Club Gala, on 5th September; Midland Counties at Dundee, on 15th July, on the occasion of the opening of New Baths there, and against Northern Counties at Aberdeen, on 2nd September. All three Matches resulted in handsome victories for the Western Counties' representatives, the scores being, Eastern Counties, 6-0; Midland Counties, 6-0; Northern Counties, 3-1. Team Races (5 a-side) which preceded the Matches were also won somewhat easily by the W.C.A.S.A. teams.

**Polo Cup.**—Fourteen Clubs were drawn in this Competition, and in the final tie the Paisley Amateurs won from Glasgow Amateurs by 11 goals to nil. Paisley also distinguished themselves in bringing the Scottish Polo Cup to the Western District, and are to be congratulated on their double achievement, which was brought about by consistent good play. Several representative Polo Matches were played during the year, among them being Renfrewshire *versus* Lanarkshire, Glasgow *versus* Paisley and Govan, and Private *versus* Public Baths, the teams for which were selected by the Polo Committee.

Much credit is due Mr. J. G. M'Lachlan (Paisley) and his Committee for the able manner in which they have performed their work.

**Baths.**—The Baths Convener reports that during the season the Committee had before them various matters relative to the facilities for the teaching of learners in the various Baths, and the boarding up of the steps in the ponds, so as to ensure scratch and limit men a foothold for turning. They were successful in getting several suggested improvements in these connections carried out. Several other minor matters affecting Clubs were brought under the notice of the Convener, but as the interested Clubs neglected to complain officially, the Committee were unable to bring



them under the notice of the Corporation. In this connection the Committee are of opinion that Clubs should take a united and greater interest, and as the Club hour is admittedly the most remunerative, our claims should, therefore, have all the greater weight. Thanks are due Mr. P. S. Fraser (West of Scotland) and his Committee for their labours during the year.

**Departures.**—I regret to have to record the loss to our District, and indeed to Scotland, of three of its best swimmers in the persons of Messrs. James S. Yuille and Charles D. Risk (Victoria Baths) and James Murphy (Fairfield) who, in the course of the past season left these shores to seek their fortune in Canada. All were well known in the Western District, and took with them to their new sphere the best wishes of Western swimmers. It was a matter for gratification that shortly before his departure last Autumn Mr. Risk annexed the 100 Yards Scottish Championship.

In concluding I have to express my sincere thanks to the Association's Office-Bearers, the Conveners of the respective Standing and Special Sub-Committees, the Press, and all other workers for their assistance during the past season, and also to the Secretaries and Delegates of the Affiliated Clubs for their unflinching courtesy and forbearance with me in the performance of the duties pertaining to the office which I have the honour, by your favour, to hold.
