Minutes The minutes of the previous meeting were read & were adopted on the motion of Mr French seconded by Mr Wallace

Delegates A number of changes in club delegates were intimated and approved of

Correspondence The Secretary read a letter from Greenock A. S. C. Club requesting permit to hold a gala on 8<sup>th</sup> April. The action of the Secretary in granting permit was approved of without dissent
