Minutes of last meeting were read and adopted  
on the motion of Mr Urquhart Scott Mr McFarlane.

#### Correspondence.

A letter was read from Eastern Club, complaining  
against a fine of 1/6 charged against them, for failure  
to play a League fixture in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Division.  
The chairman ruled this business out of order, a  
ruling having been given at last meeting.  
The Eastern Club delegates stated their intention of  
appealing to higher powers.

Mr Fraser, the Motherwell convener of the Motherwell  
Gala wrote stating that the balance he had on  
hand after rounding up all accounts amounted  
to £ 3-6. and asked for permission and instructions  
from this Association to disburse this money as  
already agreed. Mr J. Graham Scott, Convener of  
Gala not being present, Mr Sheddick read a  
statement from him, which corroborated Mr Fraser's  
balance. Mr Calder moved that we ask Mr Fraser  
to hand over the moneys as previously arranged.  
50% to Boys Brigade (Motherwell), 25% for Western Counties  
and 25% for S.A.S.A. to Treasurer of Western Counties  
who will be responsible for the portion being handed  
over to S.A.S.A. any outstanding accounts to be

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paid from Western Counties Share. This matter to be taken up by Secretary. Secd. Mr Watt.

Mr Sheddell read the report of committee appointed to look into the drawing up of a form for application for reinstatement. Some small alterations had been made from the copy sent on by Mr Cubie.

Mr M'Farlane moved the adoption of their report, secnd Mr Urquhart.
