were read and adopted on the motion of Mr

Club's Gala. It was unanimously agreed on
the motion of Mr Wallace seconded by
Mr Gentle that the matter be considered at
the next monthly meeting

It was agreed on the motion of Mr Wallace seconded by Mr Davidson that the permit for the open races be granted for the months of December & January.

A letter was read from Mr Thos Gibson, Hon Treasurer, Hamilton A.S.C. asking if a member of a club who wins two or more events on his club fixture card is permitted to have the value of his various prizes added together and given to him in one prize. It was ruled that such a proceeding was quite legal & not outwith the rules of this Association & the Secretary was instructed to write accordingly

Hamilton Crescent School F.P. Club was granted permit to hold a gala on 15th December on the motion of Mr Gentles seconded by Mr Davidson
