Western Counties A.S.C held
at their City Halls Glasgow
on Wednesday 31st January 1917
at 8 pm Mr J.B. Reid presided
over a fair attendance

Minutes The minutes of the previous monthly meeting were read
and adopted on the motion of Mr H. Walker seconded by Mr
A. Pettigrew

Correspondence Changes were intimated in a number of Clubs' delegations
Laws agreed to.

Hamilton Club Representation Committee asked for a
permit for gala on 3rd January 1917 in aid of local
charities. The Secretary's action in granting permit
was homologated.

Dennistoun Baths A.S.C wrote asking for permits to
hold galas on 25th, 26th, 27th, 28th & 29th March. The
Secretary reported that he had granted these permits
this action was approved of. This club also asked
permits for two polo matches - Paisley v Glasgow
Select and Western Baths v Private Baths and also
a School-boys team race. These permits
were unanimously granted, and the selection of
the Polo Teams was referred to the Water Polo
Selection Committee.

Mr Geo Morrison Beckford Street Hamilton wrote
asking permit for gala on Saturday 27th January
in aid of the School Boy Scouts Camp Fund.
The necessary fee of 2/- was enclosed. The Secretary

Confer reported that he had granted permit and his action was approved of. On the motion of Mr. A. Wallace it was unanimously agreed to return the £1/- as a donation from the association.

Cllr James Walker, Sup't Hamilton Baths, wrote on behalf of Hamilton Corporation, requesting permit to hold Anniversary Gala on Monday 26th February 1912 & enclosed the fee of £1/-

On the motion of Cllr A. Pettigrew the permit was granted and the £1/- returned as a donation from the association.

Hamilton Burgh Police A.S.C. wrote applying for affiliation to the Association & enclosed the fee of 10/- The Secretary reported that the rules as submitted were in order, and on the motion of Cllr W. Shannon seconded by Cllr A. Walker, the club were admitted to membership as from 1st February.

Hamilton Ladies A.S.C. wrote applying for affiliation to the association, but failed to remit the fee of 10/- The Secretary reported that their rules as submitted were in order. The Secretary was instructed to write for the fee and on the motion of Mr. A. Wallace seconded by Cllr A. Logan it was agreed to admit the club as members on the day on which the Secretary received the fee.

A letter was read from the Premier Ladies Club suggesting that the Corporation of Glasgow might be approached with a view to presenting a

Trophy for competition among ladies or girls similar to the Corporation Shield, and asked the Association to take the matter in hand.

On the motion of Mr J H Shredder seconded by Mr Harper it was agreed to refer the letter to the Banks Committee for consideration and report.

The complaint by the Paisley Amateurs S.C. against the Glasgow Amateurs S.C. for alleged non-payment of 17 seats & tea booked for the Paisley club's gala on 29 Sept & which was held over from meeting on 6th December was considered. In this connection a letter was read from the Glasgow Amateurs signed by Mr Wm Campbell President pointing out that no authority was given any of their members to pledge the credit of their club in connection with the Paisley club's gala and that any claim against the club must therefore fall. After hearing lengthy statements from Mr J G McLauchlan (Paisley) & Mr J G Lamond (Glasgow Amateurs) it was unanimously agreed on the motion of Mr A. Wallace seconded by Mr A. Ingles to take no action on the matter.

Report on

Runway

The Secretary reported that in accordance with the Association's instructions at the December monthly meeting the revision in the Moir Cup Breast Stroke Scratch race took place in Gorbals Baths on Wednesday 24th January 1912 & had resulted: 1st James Wilson Eastern and J Douglas Glasgow Amateurs 2nd T. Johnstone Eastern. The Secretary also reported that prior to the start of the race the Referee Mr A. Wallace, Dalmuir, had received a

written intimation from Messrs J. Wilson and
J. Johnstone (Eastern) that they were swimming
under protest.

A letter was read from Mr J.H. Sheddell
Secretary S.A.S.A. intimating that he had received
an appeal from ~~Mr~~ J. Wilson & (Eastern) against
the decision of the W.C. A.S.A. in ordering the
Moor Cup race to be re-swum.

Protest from E.A.S.C.

The Secretary also read a letter from the
Eastern Club protesting against the decision
of the judges in the reswim on 24th January in
awarding 2nd place to Mr J. Douglas (Glasgow
Amateurs) on the ground that he did not
comply with the rules for the conduct of the
race as laid down by the Northern Club in
respect that when finishing Douglas
touched first with the left hand and then
with the right hand. On the motion of
Mr J. H. Sheddell seconded by Mr G. J. Campbell
it was unanimously agreed to delay consideration
of the Eastern Club's protest until the Annual
General Meeting on 21st February 1912 pending
the decision of the S.A.S.A. General Committee
on 10th February 1912 on the Wilson
appeal.

Applications for reinstatement

Applications for re-instatement as amateurs
were received from Mr J. B. Pringle (Eastern)
and Arthur Thomson (Gartsherrie). On
the motion of Mr James Watt seconded by
Mr McGregor both were approved &
ordered to be sent to S.A.S.A.

Mr Stewart submitted a report on the proposal of the Baths Department of the Corporation to erect an aeration installation in Gorbals Baths & also referred to the question of season-tickets for the baths.

Selection
Committee

Mr James Watt had no report to submit.

Engraving
of
Polo
Cup

The Honorary Treasurer called attention to the bad condition of the Polo Cup & suggested that it should be replated. He also reported that the Murray Shield required new studs for engraving the winners' names. On the motion of Mr A. Wallace seconded by Mr James Watt the Treasurer was authorized to have the polo cup replated and also to have a strip of silver or new studs put on the Murray Shield.
