The minutes of the previous meeting
were read & adopted on the motion

Correspondence. Communications were read from
various clubs intimating changes of
delegates.

Hillfort Gala A letter was read from Mr. Hare
of Hillfort asking for permit to
hold a Gala & enclosing £1.1/-
for permit fee. The permit was granted
& the fee returned.

Ferguslie Club wrote enclosing 10/- for affiliation
fee. They were unanimously admitted
to membership.

Come Street School A letter was read from W. Grummond
the headmaster enclosing permit fee
of £1.1/- & asking that Miss Dina
Hickey be allowed to give an
exhibition at a small Gala to be
held in the school baths.

It was agreed that permission be
granted & that the fee of £1.1/-
be returned.

Stephens wrote asking for permission to hold a Swimmers Gala on 4th September. His request was granted & also the request of the Boat Club to hold their Gala on the 18th September instead of the 17th September.

Western Amateurs asked for permission to hold a polo match at their Gala, the teams to be composed of players whose clubs practice in baths on the North side of the river versus players whose clubs practice on the South side. It was agreed to grant permission.

West of Scotland were also granted permission to hold an inter-city match Glasgow versus Paisley.

Selcoats wrote asking for permit to hold a race for unattached swimmers from the surrounding districts. It was agreed to grant permit provided all the swimmers were amateurs.

Alloa asked that they be allowed to hold their Gala on 24th Sept instead of 1st Oct. This was agreed to.

Gilmers A letter was read from W. G. Gilmers pointing out that the Association had broken two rules by drawing the 2nd round of the Western District S. A. A. & C. ^{Western Gala} Championships before the 1st round was played, and that the results of matches had been sent to the Polo Committee.
