



DAVE HALLER

APPOINTED AS SCOTLANDS DIRECTOR OF SWIMMING

The Scottish Amateur Swimming Association has taken two years to fill the vacancy caused by the departure of John Hogg to Canada in September 1974. However, the announcement by the Association that they have appointed Britains number one coach should be welcomed by all interested in improving Scotland's position in world swimming.

Thirty-one year old Englishman Dave Haller will commence his duties at the beginning of September. He will be based at Stirling University.

As a member of the Southampton swimming club he represented Britain at the 1964 Olympics in Tokyo. In 1967 he started coaching his former club under the very experienced coach Derek Snelling, who left for Canada and Haller took over as chief coach to Southampton. Snelling is chief coach to the Canadian Olympic Team.

After eighteen years with the Southampton Club Dave joined the City of Cardiff Club. Since he joined the Welsh club, he has coached them to many national successes. Earlier this year at the ASA Short Course Championships at Worthing, Cardiff swimmers won ten of the twenty-four titles. Eight members from clubs have been included in the British Olympic Team. At a press conference in Glasgow,

Dave was very aware of his new challenge which he has accepted. He stated, "the fact that swimmers are being tempted to American Universities is an indictment of our own lack of facilities. Hopefully, Stirling could offer a very attractive alternative to the States". "I see myself as a swimmers man, and a coaches man and my first task will be to establish a bond between myself and all Scottish coaches. We must all pull together." "At the start, I'll be doing a fair bit of travelling. I want to visit every swimming club and meet every swimming coach in Scotland and see how they work in their own environments."

The new coach has two main targets, "the Commonwealth Games in two years and the Moscow Olympics in 1980. He intimated, "to be honest, the standard of Scottish swimming is not particularly high. But the potential is there. All I must do is make sure that the potential is realised."



OLYMPIC REVIEW



MONTREAL 1976

The Swimming centre is located under the heel of the tower, the swimming centre has a surface area of almost 10,000 square metres. The main pool 50 x 25 x 2 metres. The diving pool 25 x 25 metres and the diving boards at 3.5; 7.5; and 10 metres. There is provision for 10,000 spectators. The dressing room has 1500 cubicles.

Olympic Flame "Electrified"

The Olympic Flame for the 1976 Olympic Games will be transported to Canada from Greece via satellite as

modern technology and games tradition become one.

The process will start traditionally at 11. a.m. (local time) July 13 when the flame will be lit by sun rays at the Temple of Hera at Olympia Greece.

Runners will carry it to Athens, arriving there July 15 and a Canadian athlete will light the flame at Panathenian Stadium.

The torch will then be carried to another urn, where through the use of an electric sensor, the particles will be transformed into electric impulses which will be transmitted by satellite to Ottawa, Canada.

A laser beam at the receiving end will convert the impulses back to the flame's original form and Canadian runners will carry the torch to Montreal where at 4.30 p.m. July 17, it will enter Olympic Stadium.

The Olympic Village

The "Pyramid City" is an apt description for the Montreal Olympic Games Village. The complex consists of four 17 story sloping towers, grouped together by a central core

giving the impression of two glistening white pyramids.

Each of the four towers contain 233 apartments making an overall total of 932.

During the games these will be partitioned off into 3812 units to house more than 9,000 athletes and officials from the 131 nations expected to compete.

The seven acres of grounds include swimming pool, outdoor theatre and Place de Nations where flags from competing countries will fly throughout the games. Dining room facilities include a cafeteria to serve 4500 persons a sitting and an international restaurant seating 400.

During their stay competitors and officials are expected to consume about 1,500 tons of food. At each meal there will be a choice of three soups, five main dishes, six vegetables and at least five desserts.

A charge of twelve dollars a day for accommodation and meals will be made for each occupant in the Olympic Village.





OLYMPIC TRIALS

The Olympic Trials which took place in the Derby Baths Blackpool on 28/29 May, caused tears, jubilation, nerves and many upsets.

Criticism must be laid at the Great Britain Committee for the selection of this venue. For this important event, no electronic timing was available and this was to cause embarrassment to the officials. Undoubtedly, the trials should have been held at The Royal Commonwealth Pool, Edinburgh with the best facilities. Perhaps, the Great Britain Committee could place International fixtures in Edinburgh rather than the two favourites Leeds or Crystal Palace.

First Session

Fifteen year old Paul Sparkes (London) swam the race of his life finishing second inside the standard time. Sparkes time 16 min.3.9 secs was a new British, English Junior record. The winner of this event was David Parker (Coventry) his time 16 min.2.1 secs.

The women's 800 metres Freestyle was very disappointing, the early pace was too slow. Debbie Simpson (Dundee NCR) who had spent six months in Canada under John Hogg returned home with good times but could only finish second in 9 min.18.3 secs. Sue Barnard was the winner in 9 min.18.1 secs with Lindsay Heggie (Warrington) third in 9 min.19.2 secs.

Second Session

Sue Richardson (Beckenham) continued to reduce her own British record for the third time in May in the Women's 400 Ind. Medley. Miss Richardson's time of 5 min.2.1 secs placed her among the ten best in the world. In second place was Anne Adams (Cardiff) also in a good time 5 min.3.8 secs (Welsh record). In third place was American trained Ann Bradshaw from South Africa whose time was 5 min.8.3 secs.

In the men's 200 metres Backstroke Paul Lerpinere (Millfield) led all the way to produce a standard time 2 min.8.7 secs. Missing from this event was Jim Carter who did not return home for these trials. Carter has done a time of 2 min.6.87 secs among the top ten in the world.

Nineteen year old Margaret Kelly (Cardiff) produced a great swim in the women's 200 metres Breaststroke to win in a new Commonwealth, British and English record time 2 min.38.6 sec. The Cardiff trained student led from the start, in second place was Debbie Rudd (Solihull) in 2 min.41.2 sec. Thirteen year old Carol Mason (Southport) was placed third in 2 min.43.0 secs. Missing was Christine Jarvis who recorded a time of 2 min.40.6 in the States.

The major upset of these trials came in the men's 200 metres Butterfly with the defeat of Brian Brinkley (Bedford) by Sean Maher (Newport) captain of the Miami University Swimming team. Maher took an immediate lead from the start to win all the way in a new Welsh record time of 2 min.3.7 secs. Brinkley finished second in 2 min.4.7 secs and Scottish Internationalist Gordon Hewit (Cardiff) was placed third inside the Olympic standard and a new Scottish record time of 2 min.5.1 secs.

The women's 100 metres Backstroke became a battle between Joy Beasley (Junction 10) and Mandy James (Cardiff) both girls finishing together. The judges decision was Miss Beasley first with the Cardiff schoolgirl in second place. However, the evidence from the timekeepers showed that they totally disagreed with the result. The red haired girl from Cardiff had the fastest time, this was indeed a case for electronic timing. The final outcome was a new British and English senior and junior record for Joy with Mandy receiving the same time in a new senior and junior Welsh record.

Third Session

The women's 100 metres freestyle produced a great dual between Elaine Gray (City of Glasgow) and Sue Edmondson (Coventry). From the gun Miss Gray took the lead over the English girl. At the half way mark Elaine went through in 27.5 on target to beat that standard time. However, over the final 15 metres three swimmers were together — Gray, Edmondson and Debbie Hill (Portsmouth). The wall came in time for a tiring Scot who won in a new British and Scottish record time 60.2 secs. Second place went to Edmondson with the same time as the winners new English record with Debbie Hill third in 60.4.

Although none of these swimmers made the standard time these three competitors plus Ann Bradshaw (Kingsbury) whose time 60.7 all adds up to a standard time for the freestyle relay.

A great solo effort by Kevin Burns (York) in an early heat of the 100 metres freestyle gave him a time inside the standard time his time 53.2. This put pressure on the swimmers on the final heat. After false starts, Gordon Downie (Warrender) lead at the turn from Mike Smith (Radcliffe), but the police cadet held on over the final 10 metres to win the heat over the tiring Downie in a time 53.4 inside the time. Sadly, Downie failed by one-tenth of a second. The men's 200 metres Breaststroke event ended with David Leigh (Cardiff) touching ahead of main rival Paul Naisby (Sunderland) the winners time 2 min.24.5.

Jane Alexander (Cardiff) made a late effort to win the women's 200 Butterfly in 2 min.19.5 (British and English record) with Anne Adams (Cardiff) second in a new Welsh record time 2 min.22.0 secs.

Alan McClatchey (Warrender) and Duncan Cleeworth (Tyldesley) battled it out over the 400 metres Medley. Cleeworth pulled up over the Breaststroke leg, with the Scot forced to pull everything out over the freestyle leg winning in 4 min.35.7 with Cleeworth second in 4 min.36.5.

Fourth Session

In the women's 400 freestyle Sue Edmondson (Coventry) was the only swimmer to make the standard time in this event. The time 4 min.29.0 secs a new English record.

Brian Brinkley stormed home over the final length to win the 400 metres freestyle in 4 min.3.8 with Scot Alan McClatchey second in 4 min.4.9 secs. American student Gordon Downie (Warrender) was placed third in 4 min.5.1 Margaret Kelly achieved the double when she won the women's 100 metres Breaststroke in 1 min.15.2 sec. The fight for the remaining places ended with Helen Burnham (Beckenham) second in 1 min.15.7 and Debbie Rudd (Coventry) third in 1 min.15.8 sec. Chris Jarvis was missing from this event having decided to stay in America.

Gary Abraham (C of S'ampton) failed in his bid to qualify for the men's 100 metres Backstroke his time 60.3 was just one-tenth out.

Another British record fell in the women's 100 Fly with Joanne Atkinson (Millfield) winning in 64.3 secs. Jane Alexander was second in 64.8 sec with Sue Jenner third in 65.7.

The first three in the men's 200 metres freestyle were inside the standard time Brinkley — 1 min.55.0, Downie — 1 min.55.5, McClatchey — 1 min.56.8 and David Dunne (Beckenham) will make up the relay team his time 1 min.57.4.

Nineteen year old Anne Bradshaw was the first girl to break the qualifying time in a freestyle event. The African born Bradshaw who lives in South Africa, but trains in the States, returned 2 min.9.1 in the second heat of the 200 metres freestyle for a new British and English record. However, these records were broken by Sue Barnard (Cardiff) in the final heat her time was 2 min.8 sec. with Sue Edmondson (Coventry) also inside her time was 2 min.8.5 secs.

The result of the men's 100 metres Breaststroke was reversed from the 200, Naisby the victor 66.7 with Leigh 66.8. Both swimmers inside the standard time.

Kim Wilkinson (Coventry) received the judges verdict in the women's 200 metres Backstroke her time 2 min.24.2 sec. (British and English record) Joy Beasley was second in 2 min.24.3 with Sharron Davies (Plymouth) third in 2 min.24.8 Mandy James was also inside the set time 2 min.24.9.

Prior to the final event Brinkley had elected not to swim in this event the 100 Fly at Montreal. However, this decision did not hinder his effort in this event winning in 57.3. In second place was John Mills (Sutton) his time 57.5 was inside that time; and John Park (Leeds) was third in 57.6. Richard Iredale (Cardiff) came fourth also inside the qualifying time and so he will get his chance at Montreal. This race was another event when electronic timing would have helped. The final placing for the remaining two places would appear to have been reversed by the judges. From the poolside Steve Nash (Cardiff) seemed to be (5th) in 59.0 but the judges gave their verdict to Mark Thorne (Coventry).
