



Commonwealth Games Policy Finally Agreed

● After several months of uncertainty and speculation the Commonwealth Games Council for Scotland have finally 'seen the light' and agreed to accept the Scottish Amateur Swimming Association's selection policy proposals.

Agreement was reached after a series of emergency meetings during January and February following an initial allocation of only 5 aquatics team places – an offer which the Association did not consider acceptable. According to press reports the Council's principal criterion was to **only** send potential finalists to Auckland, thereby ensuring a quality team of athletes.

The Scottish ASA have attempted to comply with this criteria by issuing a selection policy which they estimate will be the requirement to reach the final eight in Auckland.

Ron Taylor, the Team Manager, believes the final team size will be in the region 16-20 – one thing is certain there are bound to be more than 5...

Commonwealth Games Selection Policy – Auckland 1990 – Swimming

- The selection criteria and qualifying times, as a guideline for selection, are:
 1. The Scottish Selectors will consider times achieved at recognised Long Course competitions held between 1st January – 19th November, 1989.
 2. The team selection will be made following the 1989 European Championships (from 12-20th August) in Bonn. The final team selection will take place immediately following the English Winter Championships (from 15-19th November) in Leeds.
 3. Swimmers achieving the qualifying standard (up to a maximum of 3 per event) will qualify for selection – subject to fitness and current form.
 4. Consideration will be given to swimmers who have not achieved the qualifying standard in order to submit the strongest possible relay teams.

Diving

- The selection criteria and qualifying standards, as a guideline for selection are:

The Scottish selectors will consider performances achieved at the following recognised events: Welsh ASA Championships (4-5th May) Cardiff; Scottish National Championships (17-18th June) Edinburgh; ASA Winter Championships (19-22nd October) Crystal Palace, London.

Final team selection will take place immediately following the ASA Winter Championships on 22nd October, 1989.

Divers achieving 3rd place or higher in any of the recognised competitions will qualify for selection subject to fitness and current form. Providing these championships are of a comparable standard.

Should no diver achieve the above criteria, consideration will be made according to circumstances.

Synchronised Swimming

- The qualifying standard as a guideline for selection is:

Scottish selectors will consider performances achieved at the ASA National Championships (4-5th November).

Selection will take place immediately following these Championships on 5th November, 1989.

The highest placed Scottish swimmer (within the top 12 places) will qualify for selection subject to fitness and current form.

Should no Scottish swimmer achieve the above criteria consideration will be made according to circumstances.

Stakis Hotels Back Scottish Swimming

● Stakis Hotels are to continue their support for swimming in Scotland with a £75,000 sponsorship deal which will run through 1989/90 and cover a wide spectrum of important swimming events and meets.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

Competition Reviews

Golden Cup Meet – Geneva (Long Course)

● A small but highly successful Esso squad returned home from Switzerland last month with a total of 14 medals (6G–4S–4B), plus 1 Scottish Junior Record and 18 personal bests. **Faye Phimister** (Moray Dist.) won one gold and two silver medals; the gold came in the 100m Free in 1.01.81. **Simon Capaldi** (Warrender), who must surely be a contender for the fastest Improving Age Grouper in Scotland at present, won two golds – 100m Free 57.99 and 100m Fly 1.02.53. Club team-mate **Dominic Shiels** won two golds also – 100m Breast 1.12.24 and 200m Ind. Med. 2.24.51.

Carneval Meet – Viareggio (Short Course)

● Despite a lengthy journey due to the fog, the Esso Youth and Junior Squad produced some remarkable performances in Italy. **Clair Taylor** (Peterhead) was the most successful collecting 2 silvers in the 100m Fly 1.09.34 and the 200m I.M. 2.34.79. Other silver medal winners were: **Fiona Murray** (Paisley) 100m Free 1.02.62 and **Jamie McNeil** (Miln. & B.) 100m Back 1.02.84. Bronze medals came from **Stephanie McDonald** (Paisley), **Jill James** (Ythan), **Tracy Wheatley** (E.K.), **Jamie Sidey** (Cumbernauld), **Ryan Watt** (Fraserburgh), **Fraser Walker** (Warr.) and **Iain McCallum** who recorded a 52.76 in the 100m Freestyle final.

Southampton Meet (Short Course)

● A large team of 19 swimmers competed in the 4th leg of the G.B. Grand Prix in Southampton. **Scott Milne** (Peterhead) began the year in fine form when he produced a 2.07.32 to take 5th place in the 200m Fly final. Scott also finished 6th in the 400m Free in 4.06.48 (heat time). **Neil Curran** also produced some impressive early season form in the Breaststroke events with a 30.25 (50), 1.06.25 (100) and 2.24.67 (200). There were a number of top Scottish swimmers competing under their club banner at this Meet. The most successful was **Ruth Gilfillan** who recorded new Scottish record figures in the 400m Freestyle of 4.14.11.

Two World Records for Martin

Martin Lee (Fins Swim Club) – World Games for the Deaf, Christchurch, New Zealand – January 1989

● Martin first represented the G.B. Deaf Team at the World Games in Los Angeles as a 15-year-old in 1985. On that occasion he returned with two silver medals and a bronze. The silver medals came in the 4×100m Med. and Free. Relays and the bronze for the 1500m Free. individual event.

This year Martin was again selected for the World Games for the Deaf in Christchurch, New Zealand, and returned with the highest number of individual medals of any G.B. competitor at the Games as well as two Deaf world records. His medal winning performances at the Games were as follows:

100m Breaststroke, gold medal, 1.07.70 (World, European and British Record); 200m Breaststroke, gold medal, 2.28.39 (World, European and British Record); 400m Ind. Med., gold medal, 4.50.29; 4×100m Freestyle Relay, gold medal, 1st leg, 55.80 (P.B.); 4×200m Freestyle Relay, gold medal; 4×100m Medley Relay, bronze medal, Breast leg. All events were held in 50m outdoor pool.

Motherwell Masters



● The Masters Section of Motherwell ASC was formed in 1983. Since then the club has gone from strength to strength with 1988 proving their best so far. Towards the end of the year 20 members made the long trip to Brisbane, Australia (at their own expense) to compete in the world championships. **Eddie Riach** (35-39) took the gold in the 200m Backstroke and added a bronze for the 100m swim. **Forbes Gentleman** (65-69) took 3rd place in a close finish in the 200m Freestyle. Several swimmers finished in the top half-dozen places including **Sadie Franklyn** (55-59) and **Tony Jarvis** (40-44).

After their return the swimmers set up no fewer than nine Masters World Records at the GB and West District Championships. Once again **Eddie Riach** was to the fore smashing the 200m Ind. Med. record and also the 200m Backstroke. **Forbes Gentleman** took the 100m Freestyle record. **Tony Jarvis** also broke two records: the 50m Freestyle and 100m Freestyle. The other records were in team races: the

200+ team setting new figures for the Freestyle with Hugh Cumberland, John Brogan, Ken McKay and Tony Jarvis. Jim MacTaggart replaced John Brogan in the Medley event. The 240+ team of Jim Gibson, Jim Motion, Ken McKay and Forbes Gentleman smashed both records in their section taking five seconds off the previous best times.

During the year the club won top club trophies at Stockport and Dundee both for the 4th consecutive year and at Dundee in November lifted the trophy at the GB Championships with 46 gold, 33 silver and 29 bronze medals in individual events plus 9 team golds, 4 silver and 1 bronze. The squad, apart from the world records, broke 11 British records and many Scottish best times.

In 1989 the club will be represented at Aarhus, Denmark, at the World Masters Games.

Unfortunately, in the autumn the old baths at High Road, Motherwell, which, with Mr David Crabb as coach, produced many Olympians and Commonwealth swimmers in the 1940's and early 50's, is closing and all the swimmers, both Masters and youngsters, will have to travel further afield for their training as the new complex has no facilities for competitive swimming.

European Junior Selection Policy

● The team will be chosen on Wednesday, 21 June when the selectors will consider times recorded by electronic timing in recognised Long Course competitions held between 1 March and 18 June. It is anticipated that the maximum team size will be 26.

The selection criteria, and 'A' and 'B' consideration times, as a guideline for selection, are:

1. Where two or more swimmers achieve the A time it is likely that two will be selected, subject to current form and fitness.
2. Priority consideration will be given to relay team selection where the relay team is judged to be of sufficiently high calibre.
3. Where no swimmer has achieved an A time the swimmers achieving the fastest B times will be considered again subject to current form and fitness.
