

SCOTTISH AMATEUR SWIMMING ASSOCIATION

Report to Swimming Committee (20th May 1990) on the business of the Amateur Swimming Federation of Great Britain (ASF GB) Technical Swimming Committee.

There has been only one meeting of the Technical Swimming Committee (28th March at York) since our last meeting of the SASA Swimming Committee. That meeting was attended by Mr. Sheppard (ex-officio), Mr. H.H. Smith (Director of Swimming) and your Convener. The following points were noted :-

- (1) Mr. Rick Bailey was appointed as Secretary to the Committee.
- (2) Several changes were made to the 'Spring Trophy International' selection due to the non-availability of certain swimmers.
- (3) In discussion on the nomination criteria for FINA Officials it was established that service to National Championships could be substituted for International experience, there being so few International opportunities available for many GB Technical Officials.
It was also agreed that when a GB fixture is held, the promoting Association should invite two officials from each of the other Associations.
- (4) The Committee recommended criteria, pre-selection and staffing for the LEN Open International Cup in Rome (August '90) : See attached
- (5) The Committee recommended criteria, pre-selection and staffing for the World Championships in Australia (Perth : 8th-13th January 1991) : See attached
- (6) The Committee recommended staffing for the European Championships in Athens in 1991 and the Olympic Games in Barcelona in 1992 : See attached

Note : Items 4,5 and 6 above subsequently approved by the ASF GB Committee on 6th April 1990.

- (7) For the European Junior Championships (Dunkirk, July 1990) the following detailed arrangements were noted :-
 - (a) Selection meeting : 20th June at York ;
 - (b) Team Assembly at Crystal Palace on 16th July for training and travelling to Dunkirk by bus and ferry on 20th July ;
 - (c) Date of Championships - 26th to 29th July ;
 - (d) Return journey on 30th July.
- (8) A revised version of the ASF GB Code of Conduct was approved.
- (9) The matter of a Sports Science and Testing Programme could not be furthered until the outcome of the ASA submission to the Sports Council was known (ie after 3rd April 1990).

- (10) A 'Think Tank' report recommending the appointment of a National Performance Director was supported in principle for submission to ASF GB.

LEN OPEN INTERNATIONAL CUP : ROME : 9TH/12TH AUGUST 1990

SELECTION POLICY

1. The team to be selected immediately after the A.S.A. National Swimming Championships on Sunday 29th July at Crystal Palace.

2. Pre-selections:

Adrian Moorhouse - 100m Breaststroke
Nick Gillingham - 200m Breaststroke

3. The remainder of the team will be selected on the results of the A.S.A. National Championships on the following basis:-

- a) the winner of each Individual event to be selected **EXCEPT** where there has been a pre-selection.
- b) In an event where there is a pre-selected swimmer, the highest placed other swimmer would be considered at this stage.
- c) Teams and second string swimmers for individual events **ON THE BASIS OF POINTS SCORING POTENTIAL** in this competition will be selected up to the number of places available.

4. General Notes on Selection

- a) Swimmers to be selected on places gained in finals; these to take priority over heat and 'B' final times and placings. 'B' final placings take priority over heat times and placings. This also applies for all relay team selections.
- b) Times returned in club relays not to be considered.
- c) Split times (team or individual) not to be considered.
- d) Should an individual event not have both places filled after the agreed number of competitors have been selected, then additional entries can be made from those already included in the team.

5. Training and Travel

The teams will travel to Rome on Thursday 2nd August for a short training and acclimatisation period at the venue.

The teams will return on Monday 13th August.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS : PERTH, AUSTRALIA : 8TH/13TH JANUARY 1991

SELECTION POLICY

1. The team will be selected from performances at the A.S.A. National Swimming Championships, 26th/29th July 1990, the LEN Open International Cup, Rome 9th/12th August and the A.S.A. Winter Championships, 15th/18th November.
2. Consideration times will be used for individual selections. These are based on the 16th place in the 1989 World Rankings plus January 1990 times on a basis of two swimmers per country.
3. In considering team relay selections, the criteria will be based upon the potential of a team to reach the World Championship final in that event.
4. Pre-selections:

Adrian Moorhouse - 100m Breaststroke
Nick Gillingham - 200m Breaststroke
5. Additional pre-selections of potential World Championship medallists will be made in late August based on the A.S.A. National Swimming Championships and performance and places achieved in the LEN Open Cup. For this, swimmers must have achieved Consideration Times at one of the aforementioned events.
6. No more than one swimmer per event to be pre-selected.
7. The final selection to be made after the Winter Championships, when performances at all three events will be considered.
8. General Notes on Selection
 - a) Swimmers to be selected on places gained in finals; these to take priority over heat and 'B' final times and placings. 'B' final placings take priority over heat times and placings. This also applies for all relay team selections.
 - b) Times returned in club relays not to be considered.
 - c) Split times (team or individual) not to be considered.
 - d) Should an individual event not have both places filled after the agreed number of competitors have been selected, then additional entries can be made from those already included in the team.
9. All pre-selected swimmers must show their fitness and form by competing in the A.S.A. Winter Championships.
10. Swimmers living and training overseas must comply with this Selection Policy.
11. Training and Travel
 - a) The team will travel to Australia on approximately 17th December 1990 for a training camp and will move into Perth on 27th December for final preparation. Return home on 14th January 1991.
 - b) All selected team members must attend the training camp.
