REPORT on behalf of the SWIMMING COMMITTEE to the SASA COUNCIL MEETING of
10th June 1990

1. Confirmation of Previous Minutes

The Minutes of the Swimming Committee Meetings of 11th March (subject to minor amendments), 1st April (Bruce Hotel) and 1st April (Dollan Baths) were all approved at the Meeting of 20th May.

2. Subsequent Meeting

The draft Minute of the Meeting of 20th May has been circulated for information and reference.

3. Matters Arising

The following points are particularly noted for the consideration of Council :-

Page 4 : Item 5 e : Working Group on the Training and Competition of
Young Swimmers

Following a meeting between the Convener and Mr. Raeburn, the Swimming Committee supported a proposal to form a Working Group under the convenership of Mr. Raeburn to investigate and research into the training and competition of young swimmers. The Swimming Committee agreed to underwrite the costs of the first meeting and to invite the Working Group to submit a programme with costs for further consideration. The approval of Council is sought for this proposed action.

Page 4 : Item 6 : Budget

The Swimming Committee received a tabled paper identifying costs which were subsequently adjusted. As Convener, I have to emphasise my concern that budget control is extremely difficult if the Committee does not receive regular and fully reliable financial reports.

The main business under this heading was to adjust future planned expenditure in the light of previous expenditure and to take account of 'borrowing' which had supported the 1990 Commonwealth Games. As a result of detailed consideration, the following actions are recommended to Council :-

- a) To reduce the planned expenditure on the ASA Nationals and Age Group Championships by 50% (from £13,000 to £6,500) - a saving which should meet the 'worst possible' financial outcome.
- b) To seek the support of Council to 'carry-forward' into 1990/91 any part of that saving which is found to be surplus to the actual outcome of the associated fund-raising activities.

Page 5 : Item 8 : Commonwealth Games Report 1990

Because of the constraints of time, this matter was submitted to the Executive for approval of the recommended action.

Page 5 : Item 9 : International Programme Reports

The Swimming Committee recorded their congratulations to the swimmers and staff associated with the three performances which were considered to be highly successful.

Page 6 : Item 9 : LEN Congress and Calendar Conference

A separate Report is attached for reference.

Pages 6/7 : Item 10 : National Squad Programme 1990/94

The Committee gave lengthy and careful consideration to options for the next phase of development of the National Squad Programme. The outcome of that consideration being to recommend the retention of the current squads for Scottish based swimmers but with competition being mainly directed towards events within the U.K. of appropriate levels. In addition, a planned programme of training and international competition is proposed for small groups ('waves') of top-level swimmers who would form the core of the 1994 Commonwealth Games Team.

The Committee also took account of potential changes in the Sports Council policy towards funding which is anticipated to give greater recognition to and support for

excellence and for the maintenance of our national identity at international level.

The Swimming Committee seeks the approval of Council for the structure outlined in the Minute and for the submission of a case to be made to the Sports Council for additional funding.

REPORT to the SASA COUNCIL MEETING of 10th June 1990

LEN Congress and Calendar Conference : Belgrade : 24th/25th May 1990

1. Introduction

In presenting this Report it is assumed that Mr. Black (General Secretary) will be reporting separately on matters which he dealt with directly.

2. General Observations

This being my first attendance at this Congress/Calendar Conference it was valuable to have the guidance of Mr. Black and opportunity to discuss with representatives of other Associations their interpretations of events. In broad terms it would appear that :-

- a) That there is evidence of a large-scale and well organised 'lobby' which is highly influential in decision-making in terms of elections to office and of allocations of events.
- b) That there did not appear to be any pre-Congress planning or co-ordination on the part of Great Britain : Mr. Black and Mr. Pritchard (Wales) both sought pre-Congress meetings with the English representatives who, quite plainly, were not interested.
- c) Arising from the above points, that if we (Great Britain) wish to promote office-bearers or bid for events, then we will have to plan much further in advance, actively seek support for those proposals and make a major effort (including financial provision) on promotion before and during the Congress.
- d) Although apparently contradictory to item (b) above, it should be noted that the efforts made by Sheffield and the standard of their promotion/presentation were obviously very significant in obtaining the allocation of two events.

The Minutes of the Congress are attached for reference.

3. Swimming Business

Effectively this business was conducted in three parts :-

3.1 Multi-Nations

This particular grouping of national representatives was called immediately after the opening formalities of the Calendar Conference were completed, with Mr. Flavio Bomio (SUI) in the Chair. The following points were noted :-

- i) Mr. W. Fraipont (BEL) was thanked for producing the proposed revision of the Rules. It was stated that the Rules circulated for the '16 years' contest applied equally to the separate competitions for the other two age groups. The three age group contests are held simultaneously in three different locations. The revised Rules proposed were the result of the 1989 meeting and were intended for confirmation.
- ii) In relation to those age groups our (SASA) point was raised and it was agreed that :-
 - a) Swimmers had to compete in their own age group - they cannot swim in any other age group.
 - b) That the whole year (ie to 31st December) age would determine the age group categories for eligibility purposes.Finland raised the argument that the age groups should reflect those for the (LEN) European Junior events. This view was not supported by the delegates as there had been lengthy discussion in 1989 which had resulted in the proposed age groups - delegates felt that those should be tried and re-assessed in future.
- iii) Other amendments to the Rules were proposed by Israel and agreed :-
 - Rule 8 : Programme
That the preliminary Technical Meeting should determine the use and allocation of spare-lane swims.
 - Rule 10 : Jury
That in the event of there being an even number of nations participating that the Chairman should have an additional casting vote.
- iv) The fixtures for 1991 were decided as noted overleaf with the entry intentions :-

Date : all fixtures on 6th/7th April 1991

13/14 Years : Zurich (SUI) : GRE/BEL/ESP/POR/IRL/SUI (6)

15/16 Years : Israel : SUI/Scotland, provisional, POR/IRL/BEL/GRE/
FIN/CYP/DEN/ISR (10)

17/18 Years : Lisbon (POR) : POR/SUI/GRE/BEL/DEN provisional/FIN/IRL (7)

- v) Scotland was asked to host the 1991 15/16 Years contest : I declined on the grounds that we had not had opportunity to verify access/availability of suitable pools. However, I gave an undertaking to investigate the possibility of hosting an event in 1992 or 1993.
- vi) Austria had previously indicated an interest in participating in the multi-nations events : the meeting agreed unanimously to their inclusion.

3.2. 8 Nations Contest

This meeting immediately followed that for the Multi-Nations Contests and was chaired by Mr. J. J-Pritchard (Wales), the following points being noted :-

- i) Mr. Bomio (SUI) was invited to speak to his letter of 23rd April. In that statement it was acknowledged that the ability to implement the previous decisions (1989) had been left to Norway who were unable to do so because of television requirements.
The position of Ireland was discussed : their status was thought by some to be that of a guest nation until such time as they could offer a 50m pool and by others to be that of full members. Under the circumstances and on the understanding that they were still hoping to have a 50m pool by 1993, the representatives were unanimous in clarifying the position and status of Ireland as full members.
- ii) All the changes to the Rules as proposed by Mr. Bomio were accepted by a majority of 7 votes for to 1 vote against. In all cases the vote against was recorded by Norway who argued that they could not afford to send teams of 24 plus staff. This argument was not well received by the meeting because of the statements made by Norwegian representatives in Oslo (1990 Contest) regarding the large sums being spent on a small number of Norwegian swimmers and because the Rule did not require them to send 24 + staff (that being the maximum team size allowed under the new Rule). It was clearly indicated to Norway that if they wished to spend their resources elsewhere then that was their responsibility. In response the Norwegian delegate stated that he could not therefore indicate the position of his Association on future participation in the Contest. It was agreed that the position of the Norwegian Association should be notified in writing to Mr. J-Pritchard by the end of June 1990 at the latest.
- iii) The Chairman confirmed the arrangements for the 1991 Contest as follows :-
 - Dates : 20/21st April
 - Venue : Cardiff
 - Accommodation : Park or Crest Hotels at £32 for B & B and evening meal - both hotels being within 6-8 minutes walking distance from the pool
: Alternatively, accommodation could be obtained from the National Sports Centre at £27.50 for full board but delegates were advised that transport would be required.
- iv) The SASA proposal (copy attached) had been circulated at the start of the Meeting. That proposal was discussed and approved subject to two minor amendments which I accepted :-
 - (1) reduction of the Working Group to three persons by deleting host Federation in year + 3.
 - (4) that the contribution (annual) of £100 be reviewed at Cardiff and at the 1991 Len Calendar Conference.
- v) The Chairman closed the Meeting with the expression of hope on the part of all the other Nations that Norway would remain in the Contest. The Meeting agreed that in the event of Norway withdrawing, Denmark should be invited to participate.

3.3 Meet Invitations

The information on the combined Scottish National Swimming Championships and the 4th Edinburgh International Meet (13-16th June 1991) had been obtained from

Linda Fraser (EDC Marketing) immediately before departure for Belgrade and was distributed to all nations (copy attached for information). This meet was to be part of a 'trade-off' to obtain entries for small numbers of our swimmers to participate in World Cup events. The outcome of those negotiations is as follows :-

- F.R.G. (16/17 March) : letter received offering full board accommodation for 3 days for 5 persons.
- USSR (26/27 March) : negotiated with Mr. Salnikov and recorded in writing for 8 persons with all staying expenses -acceptance to be confirmed by 15th January 1991.
- Canada (5-7 April) : promised by T. Tiffany, offer to be sent.
- Sweden (19/20 March) : negotiated 4 + 1 but not confirmed in writing as agreed.
- Italy (13/14 March) : offer promised to Mr. Black and to be confirmed by letter.
- G.D.R.(23/24 March) : offer promised to Mr. Black and to be confirmed by letter.

Note : advised that USA fixture now cancelled.

Other Meet information received and forwarded to SASA Office as follows :-

- Ulster Games 1991 : 16/17 March 1991 (International Invitation)
- CIJ Meet Luxembourg : 5th-7th April 1991 (age group)
- Cardiff Speedo Meet : 4th-6th May 1991 (open)
- Lisbon Meet : 18th/19th May 1991 (open and age group)
- Sjaellands Open Meet (Greve, Denmark) : 26th/27th January 1991 (open and junior)
- Sports World Travel Information Pack for the World Championships (Perth)
- Zagreb 'Golden Bear '91' : 25th/26th May 1991 (open)

Notification of the three major open international Scottish Meets of 1991 had been prepared (copy attached) and were lodged for the Calendar. The Calendar was produced (including those meets) and issued to all nations. A copy of that official LEN Calendar has been lodged with the SASA Office.

4. Conclusions

I am grateful to the Association for providing me with opportunity to gain a valuable insight into the operation of swimming organisation (and politics !) at this level, and for the honour of jointly representing the Association. The outstanding conclusions drawn from that experience are that....

- ..we need to plan two to three years ahead of any proposed submission to the Congress/Conference..
- ..we need to invest energy and finance to support any such proposal..
- ..we need to formalise our position in respect of GB and not be labelled as 'England' (as we were at Belgrade)...
- ..we need to do everything possible to promote our Scottish National identity in the interests of our swimmers.

8 Nations Contest : Proposal

The Scottish Amateur Swimming Association requests that consideration be given to the following proposal which is not a change of rule.

The objective associated with the proposal is to provide a structure through which the quality of operation and presentation of the Contests can be monitored and by means of guidelines to the Organising Committees of the National Federations, achieve progressive improvements in standards of operation and presentation.

Proposal :-

- (1) To create a Working Group of four persons nominated by Federations on a rotational basis : (i) current host Federation (ii) host Federation in year + 1 (iii) host Federation in year + 2 (iv) host Federation in year + 3.
- (2) That in the first instance, the Working Group undertake the task of assessing recent arrangements for the operation and presentation of the Contest and for establishing guidelines for future Contests ; thereafter, to monitor those elements of future Contests and to modify/amend those guidelines accordingly.
- (3) That the Working Group report annually at the Len Congress and Calendar Conference.
- (4) That each member Federation contributes annually a sum of £100 to a holding fund which would be used to meet the expenses of the Working Group : that fund to be held by the Federation which will host the Contest in the following year.

C 7 CALENDAR CONFERENCE

- C 7.1 The Chair at the Calendar Conference shall be taken by the President or failing him one of the Vice-Presidents. The Federation promoting the Conference shall pay the accommodation of the Chairman, the Hon. Secretary and the Hon. Treasurer for one day before until 12 hours after the completion of the Conference. Their travel expenses shall be charged to LEN.
- C 7.2 Where a Federation promoting a fixture arranged at the Calendar Conference wishes to change the agreed date or venue within 6 months of that originally agreed it may only do so with the consent of the majority of the other Federations who have agreed to participate.
- C 7.3 Where a fixture involving the members of more than two Federations, has been arranged at the Calendar Conference, a Federation who undertakes to promote this fixture and cancels it within 6 months of the agreed date, shall be fined 3,000 Swiss Francs payable immediately to the Hon. Treasurer. He shall remit 2,500 Swiss Francs to the Federation who may subsequently promote the same fixture.
- C 7.4 Where a Federation withdraws from a fixture it has agreed to participate in at the Conference within 3 months of the first day of the competition, it shall be similarly fined and the remittance of 2,500 Swiss Francs made to the promoting Federation. This shall not apply to a withdrawal following a change in date or venue (see Rule 7.2).
- C 7.5 Federations not being members of LEN who participate in at the Conference shall be liable equally to such fines and shall not be permitted to take part in subsequent Conferences until any fines are paid.
- C 7.6 All fixtures made at the Conference and published in the Calendar shall be in the name of the Federation responsible.
