REPORT on behalf of the SWIMMING COMMITTEE to the SASA COUNCIL MEETING of 3rd February 1991.

### Business from 26th November 1990

The period from 26th November 1990 has been a 'busy' one for the Swimming Committee with formal business recorded as follows:-

Swimming Committee : Meeting of 2nd December 1990 : Minute approved on 23rd December without amendment.

Swimming Committee : Meeting of 16th December 1990 (am): Minute approved on 23rd December without amendment.

Swimming Committee : Selection Meeting of 16th December (pm) : Minute approved on 23rd December without amendment.

Swimming Committee : Meeting and Selection Meeting of 23rd December : Draft Minute previously circulated.

## 2. Items for the attention of Council

### (a) Minutes of 2nd December 1990

- i) Inter-District Contest: the decision taken at this Meeting was reconsidered on 23rd December in light of the responses received from the District Representatives.
- ii) Staff Selections: care was taken by the Committee to ensure that the staff selected were aware of their individual responsibility to obtain all necessary approvals (ie Club or employment) to participate and that Club Secretaries received simultaneous notification of that selection.
- iii) Scottish Club Team Relay Records: the Committee recommended that the records be established with effect from the National Short Course Championships of 1990 subject to the following criteria:
  - ( i) That the time must be achieved at an Accredited Meet;
  - ( ii) That all members of the Team must have Scottish eligibility;
  - (iii) That the events for which Records can be claimed are :-
    - 4 x 50 Freestyle Relay
    - 4 x 50 Medley Relay
    - 4 x 100 Freestyle Relay
    - 4 x 100 Medlay Relay
    - 4 x 200 Freestyle Relay

for Male or Female Teams and at Senior or Junior levels.

# (b) Minutes of 16th December 1990 (both Meetings)

i) Angela Pendrich: discussions with Mrs. Pendrich revealed that the previous correspondence from the Convener (inviting further discussion with Mrs. and Mrs. Pendrich on the matter of Sunday participation) had been deliberately ignored.

#### (c) Minutes of 23rd December 1990

- i) Angela Pendrich: the Committee gave long and careful consideration to the individual case (as clarified, in part, by telephone discussion between the Convener and Mr. Pendrich) and the principles involved. The Committee took the view that for so long as Angela is a minor she should be selected on merit for any relevant meet and that such selecti must be accepted/rejected by the swimmer as in any other case (where consultation with parents would be anticipated).

  Where such selection involved swims on a Sunday and where it was unlikely that she would accept selection, consideration could be given to selection for other meets so long as selection did not prejudice
- another swimmer of merit for selection for that meet.

  ii) Lactate Testing: subsequent to the Meeting of 23rd December, I can report that a meeting has been arranged for Tuesday 29th January 1991 at 7.30pm at Cumbernauld.

iii) Inter-District Contest: as a result of feed-back from District Representatives, it was decided not to proceed with the drafted Change

to Rule. The clear majority view was to allow further time for consideration of associated matters (eg the state and development of senior swimming) before deciding on the timing and format of future Inter-District Contests. The matter is further complicated by the 1990 Change to Rule which provides for a variable situation in respect of the number of teams entered. It was therefore decided to leave the 1989 format available as an option.

- iv) Circulation of Local Authorities: it was noted by the Committee that letters would be circulated, according to previously agreed policies, to local authorities inviting them to 'bid' for hosting National events. The Convener accepted full responsibility for the action taken at Ayr on 15th December when the decision had been taken to place the 1991. National Short Course Championships at that venue at the specific and public invitation of the Provost. The Committee homologated that action.
  - v) Budget 1991: the Committee noted that the 'pay-back' for the 1990 Commonwealth Games was not yet a specific figure. Having repaid some £8,000 from the previous allocation, the Committee agreed to set aside a further sum of £5,000 (Total £13,000) which was hoped would fully meet the required 'pay-back' when identified. Thereafter, the allocation of remaining funds was completed as recorded in the Minute.
- vi) Selections: selections for the major events in the first part of 1991 were completed as recorded in the Minute and subject to the confirmatic noted.
- vii) Changes to Rule : the draft Changes to Rule were agreed by the Committee

# Report to Swimming Committee Meeting of 10th February 1991

Meeting of the Working Group to consider the proposal to establish Lactate
Testing for National Squad Swimmers: Cumbernauld, Tuesday 29th January 1991

- On behalf of the Swimming Committee, Mr. Brown thanked Drs Howat and Robson for their proposal which had been welcomed by that Committee.
   The remit of the Working Group was to consider that proposal in detail, including cost implications, and to report back to the Swimming Committee as soon as possible.
- 2. Dr. Robson, speaking in support of the Paper submitted by Dr. Howat and himself, pointed to the danger of 'stagnation' of Scottish Swimming unless positive forward looking steps are taken to provide a monitoring service of lactate testing for our swimmers. To achieve meaningful results it would be essential to recognise standardisation of testing within the context of a planned national programme of training and competition.

  It was noted that the work undertaken by Drs. Howat and Robson in this field had achieved world-wide recognition.
- 3. In general discussion, the following points were agreed and noted :-
  - (1) That Dr. Howat would prepare a standard protocol for the tests this would be circulated to the next meeting of the Working Group for detailed consideration.
  - (2) That Dr. Howat/Dr. Robson would provide the necessary training for personnel to operate the tests and take the samples. Where analysis equipment is available to that Club, Dr. Robson would advise on the operation of that unit.
  - (3) On a postal basis, Dr. Howat advised that results would be received by the Club within two to three days.
  - (4) The cycle of testing was agreed as being approximately four weeks, arranged in consultation with the Club Coach (in association with the Director of Swimming).
  - (5) The interface between the testing and the training/competition of the selected National Squad Swimmers would be the responsibility of the Director of Swimming within the context of the National Programme. The Director would receive (simultaneously) a copy of the results and would then be able to interpret and relate those results to the training and results of the Swimmers.
  - (6) The Director of Swimming identified the possibility of obtaining Sports Council support and funding for the establishment of a data-base of information at Moray House (Cramond Campus) which would greatly assist with the building of information and personal profiles. The Working Group agreed to recommend to the Swimming Committee that an immediate approach be made to the Sports Council to that effect.
  - (7) It was noted that the necessary approvals would have to be obtained from the Swimmers for this information to be available to the Association and for storage on computer.
  - (8) The Swimmers in the Wave Programme were identified as the initial and immediate priority group for testing. However, as time and considerable detailed planning would be required to implement the proposals (if approved by Swimming Committee), it was agreed to seek the approval of Committee to start with peak lactate tests taken at the 8 Nations Contest in April 1991.
  - (9) For the longer-term objectives to be met it was recognised as being essential that all members of the Wave Programme participate fully in the training and testing programmes: it was therefore agreed that commitment to those programmes would be recommended as a requirement of all Swimmers of the Wave Programme.

- (10) It was agreed that the testing programme should be monitored on a regular basis (eg every three months) by a small group consisting of the Director of Swimming and one or both of Dr. Howat/Dr. Robson.
- (11) Drs. Howat and Robson agreed that their roles could be formally recorded as 'Sports Science Consultants'.
- (12) It was confirmed that the cost of the postal lactate testing would be £4.50 for two samples that being the total cost exclusive of time.

  Drs. Howat and Robson noted that cost as being effective for the period April 1991 to March 1992. The other costs involved would be restricted to travel and accommodation where necessary.
- (13) On the matter of consultancy 'fees', Drs. Howat and Robson would be pleased to consider an 'honorarium' from the SASA Swimming Committee.
- 4. As all members of the Working Group recognised the importance and relative urgency of the matters under consideration it was agreed that a report of the meeting and of the above recommendations should be submitted to the Swimming Committee Meeting of 10th February 1991 for approval in principle and to allow detailed planning to be undertaken.
- 5. It was agreed that the next meeting of the Working Group will be held on Tuesday 19th February 1991 at 7.30pm at Cumbernauld Pool.

  It was noted that Mr. Davidson will chair that meeting as Mr. Brown is already committed to a meeting of the Scottish Sports Association on that date.
- 6. Mr. Brown thanked the members of the Working Group for their attendance and assistance and recorded his thanks to Mr. McGowan for making facilities available to the Group.
