while I suspect that information has been distorted exaggerated somewhere along the lines of communication, it is true that members of the Swimming Committee did express great concern about matters of general palicy in respect of home based swimmers compared to those who leave Scotland to study/train abroad. However, I can assure you (and Carlyn) that the matters under consideration were not specific to individual swimmers (although cases were mentioned) and the decisions taken were those of broad policies. Therefore, I can further assure you that for so long as Carlyn and other National Squad Swimmers remain in Scotland as their base there will be no change to the levels of support which they will receive from their Districts or from the Association....provided that the means of support are still available to us.

Kit Sponsorship Agreement

A meeting was held on Saturday 15th June 1991 at East Kilbride with the Managing Director of I B Leisurewear to discuss kit sponsorship, the outcome of the negotiations is that I B Leisurewear is prepared to consider supplying equipment to all disciplines. The company now holds the franchise for the HIND PERFORMANCE brand of swimwear and technical clothing.

To enable an assessment of each discipline's "IDEAL" requirements I require the following information from your discipline:-

- 1. How many people are involved?
 - a) Competitors;
 - b) Officials Coaching and support staff, Technical;
 - c) Squads with level(eg Elite, Senior, Junior etc).
- 2. List the events with dates and venues and the status of each which you will be organising or participating in during the next 18 months. (As near as can be determined at this stage).
- 3. List the type of kit which you would wish to provide for your various levels of competitor and staff.

Some disciplines will require specialist equipment and this should be listed with a description to enable the sponsor to decide if it can be supplied. At this point in the discussions three levels of swimwear were identified: -

- A. Skinsuit with corporate logo;
- B. Special colourway with Scottish logo on standard type suit
- C. Stock suits (suitable for intermediate level competitors) When listing your requirements please indicate the level of the squad or team and whether they would receive A, B or C(category there is a OVER

considerable difference in price.)

In addition to swimwear I B Leisurewear is willing to provide other clothing that was previously supplied to the Speed Swimmers by the Woodchester Company which has withdrawn from sponsorship. It would be helpful if you could indicate the kind of clothing that your competitors and staff would prefer. The current trend for Shell Suits is very expensive at the top end of the market and the cheaper version too warm for indoor wear, your competitors may prefer a jacket and shorts or trousers that could be worn more than just once at an opening ceremony.

A REPLY IS REQUIRED BY THE 29TH JUNE IN ORDER TO COMPLETE THE NEGOTIATIONS BY THE END OF JULY. IF NO RESPONSE IS RECEIVED BY THAT DATE YOUR DISCIPLINE WILL BE EXCLUDED FROM THE NEGOTIATIONS.

Looking forward to hearing from you to enable the Association to make the most of this opportunity especially in the current financial climate.

There is also a case for additional T-shirts for staff who are required to be on the poolside for 3/4 days at a Meet

I will invite comment from the Swimming Committee on July 3rd on the above items and will advise you of any amendments as soon as possible thereafter.

SWIMMERS BASED OUTSIDE SCOTLAND

I have been hearing a lot of 'wild' talk about the situation of swimmers living and training out of Scotland - and I welcome the chance to put the record straight so far as the Swimming Committee is concerned.

- (1) Swimmers who leave Scotland to live, train and compete elsewhere are a LOSS TO SCOTTISH SWIMMING....but,....

 They are not banned from Scottish Swimming (eg Selections)

 They are not banned from Training Camps

 They are not banned from consideration for Commonwealth Games etc

 They will be treated on merit in terms of selection for these.
- (2) However, there are serious implications which we have had to consider:-
 - (a) Many of those swimmers are not available to represent Scotland on a year-to-year basis (eg 8 Nations Contest) One of the measures applied by bodies such as the Sports Council to gauge the 'investment' potential of the various sports is international competition if those swimmers are not available to us for such events then our ability to earn higher investment in Scottish Swimming falls.
 - (b) Because those swimmers are not competing regularly within Scotland there is a drop in the day-to-day standards something which will undoubtedly have a bad effect in the longer-term on the development of Scottish Swimming.
 - (c) We receive a significant proportion of our funding for Scottish Swimming from Government Grants increasingly that funding is tied to development of our sport within Scotland (eg Wave Programme funding).
- (5) The outcome of our deliberations on these matters is that we have a duty and responsibility to invest the funds we receive to the MAXIMUM POSSIBLE BENEFIT OF SCOTTISH SWIMMING in our judgement, that means that we should be directing those funds towards THOSE SWIMMERS WHO ARE LIVING, TRAINING AND COMPETING in Scotland. This will be the basis of our recommendation to SASA Council
- (4) Therefore, with the exception of the actual (finally selected) Commonwealth Games Team, we will be paying for home based Scots those living, training and primarily competing outside Scotland can participate (if selected) at their own cost.
- (5) There is one additional matter. It is appreciated that many of those who do go outwith Scotland do so because of finance (eg Sports Bursaries) associated with Higher Education provisions. We cannot do much about the latter (Universities) because we do not control them...but we can try to do something about finance...it would be utterly dishonest of me to suggest that we will be in a position to 'give you money into your Trust Funds'...but we will try.
