(f) Change to Rule 55 (Ref Page 6 Item 11)
The Swimming Committee recommends to Council that the 15 years and 16 years age groups be separated. It is also recommended that an 'enabling clause' be added to allow, if necessary, the 19/24 Age Group to be swum in conjunction with the National Open Championships.
The remit of Council in respect of restriction of eligibility for the award of ESSO Trophies to a maximum of the 17/18 Age Group can be obtained without changing the rules.

b) Recommendations to SASA Emergency Committee

It was noted that the views of the Swimming Committee had been considered and that the Council had approved the establishment of a Study Group under The original intention had been for the Chairmanship of Mr. Jack Queen. a study weekend to be held in mid-July; however that had not proved to

be practical.

As recorded in the Correspondence Report from the Convener, Mr. Queen (assisted by Mr. McGowan) had arranged for a series of interviews with indi iduals including the Swimming Convener. Those meetings were based on immediate responses from the interviewee to a standard series of questions. Prior to that interview, the Swimming Convener not being aware of that form had prepared and tabled his views as an extension to the formal submission to the Emergency Committee.

Although concerns were expressed on behalf of the East District in respect of the short notice given to some interviewees, the Meeting recognised the value of the standard format as a start to the investigation provided that the results obtained evolved into an agenda for wider ranging and more open

It was noted that no response had been received and it was therefore assumed that the matter had been satisfactorily concluded.

e) Scottish Schools Event (Ref Correspondence Item 91.308)
Mr. White had contacted Mr. Raeburn (SSSA) and advised that Mr. Raeburn we anxious to progress discussions on collaboration with the SASA to send a Scottish Schools Swimming Association Team to compete in the International School Sport Federation Meet to be held in Strasbourg (France) during the first week in July in 1992. The Meet was expected to be of a very high level.

The Convener reported that he too had received a telephone call from Mr. Raeburn during which references had been made by Mr. Raeburn to the non-cooperation of the SASA and a demand made that should the SASA not wish to cooperate in this proposed joint venture then he would expect a "full explanation to be provided, in writing".

Mr. Black (General Secretary) advised that at the initial meeting between SASA and SSSA representatives no commitment had been made by the SASA. Following consideration of the above reports, the Meeting authorised the Convener to arrange a meeting with Mr. Raeburn; the Swimming Committee to be represented by the Convener, Mr. White and the Director of Swimming. ACTION: CONVENER TO ARRANGE MEETING

National Age Group Championships
The Convener reported that the Council (Meeting of 18th August) had expressionern about the cost of Computa services for the event - particularly who much of the input had been provided on a voluntary basis by Mrs. Brockie. The Convener had advised Council that the Swimming Committee would be pleadinged, it was an objective) to process all Championships through the SASA Office but that the cost implications of that course of action should also be assessed:

 Provision of suitable computer hardware and software capable of reliable output - not just prior to a Meet but actually at the Neet (on line results);

ii) Provision of competent and reliable staff to input data and to service the Meet.

During consideration of the situation the following additional points were noted:-

iii) That in any consideration of purchases, the Association should avoid 'personalised programmes'; it was agreed that the latest Sykes Programme be investigated (thought to be some £1)

iv) That Mr. Black would contact the LEN to try to establish the identity of the programme used for the European Championships in August - a programme which provided detailed splits.

v) That consideration be given to presentation to the Sports Coufor special grant funding to assist with the provision of the total package.

Inter-District Contest

Mr. White advised the Meeting that his original contact (Mr. Penman) at Glenrothes had indicated that since the Contest is of 'National' status, pool hire charge would be nil. However, subsequent discussion identified correspondence which suggested a charge of £350 + Vat. It was determine that Mr. Dashwood-Brady and Mr. Barnett should combine to write to Glenro noting the information provided by Mr. White and seeking clarification/ confirmation of any charge (thought possibly to be waived or offset by a grant to that sum).

Mr. Dashwood-Brady (on behalf of East District) expressed concern that no

guidelines existed at the Office for the operation of the Contest. He ha had meetings with the Convener and Mr. Wilson and hoped that most matters

g) Inter-District Contest (Cont)

these had been disposed of and that no records had been retained. Consequently, the Mceting checked the following items through with Mr. Dashwood-Brady:-

i) Following identification of Glenrothes as the venue, the East Dist should have received an invitation from the Association to form an Organising Committee to be responsible for organisation/operation.

- ii) In response to a question from Mr. Davidson, Mr. Black confirmed that Districts should submit to the Secretary, 14 days in advance of the Contest, their estimate of expenses. The Treasurer could give consideration to special cases where assembly costs were involved (eg a North/Midlands swimmers from the islands).
- iii) The Convener (on behalf of Mr. Nelson) questioned the availability of food; Mr. Dashwood-Brady confirmed that cafeteria facilities were adequate.

iv) Mr. Dashwood-Brady sought and received from District Conveners ago that entries would include SASA Registration numbers - those entri to be received by Thursday 5th September at the latest.

v) It was confirmed that the lanes would rotate every second event (c male and one female) from a draw already made by the President.

Lanes for warm-up had also been allocated.

Members of the Committee supported Mr. Dashwood-Brady's concern that no formal guidelines for operation existed - further evidence of the need for a 'manual' and for the provision of reliable support and action from the SASA Office.

5. Budgets

Before inviting Mr. Charles to address the broader matters associated wi recent developments within the Association, the Convener advised the Meeting that his discussions with Nr. Charles on 15th August had confirm One or two that the Swimming Committee was within budget requirements. minor matters still had to be clarified but those would not effect that Mr. Charles confirmed that to be correct. situation. Mr. Charles outlined the current financial situation faced by the Associ and members noted the probability of an EGM on 22nd September 1991. Uni that time, every effort should be made to reduce uncommitted expenditure in that context it was considered unlikely that significant savings coul be made from cancellation of the Training Weekends. It was agreed that the identification of 1991/92 costs associated with proposed programme for that period would be undertaken at the next meet: of the Swimming Committee.

6. Selections

The Director of Swimming tabled proposals for selections for the Wave Programme 1991/92 and for the Commonwealth Games Squad 1991/92. In general discussion it was agreed that although some additional swimmer very close to the required times, only those achieving or bettering those times would be included.

The Selections are noted in Appendix 1 to this Minute.

### 7. Domestic Programme 1992

a) Age Group Structure

The Convener referred to the letter (circulated) from Mr. Black and noted the need to deal with the matter of restriction of awards sponby ESSO to a maximum age-group of 17/18 years. It was agreed that Convener should draft a Change of Rule to that effect.

ACTION: SWIMMING CONVENER

The remaining matter of separation of the 15 and 16 years was held o until the next meeting thereby allowing the views of those attending Seminar on 31st August to be taken into account.

b) Programme Update 1992
The Director tabled an outline programme (excluding the National and Age Group Championships) which was approved. (see Appendix 2)
Discussion centred on the previously noted proposal to run the Natio Age Group Championships in mid-June and the National Championships a the end of June/start of July.

Initial objections on the part of all Districts centred on the possi of having to adjust District Age Group Championships to an earlier d to allow time for processing entries. It was established that the publication of 'accepted times' for entry would enable Clubs to be certain of their entries and to make the necessary arrangements for swimmers and coaches. The timetable for processing entries was iden as :- Entries to SASA Office by midnight on Monday 1st June 1992

Tuesday 2nd/ Wednesday 3rd checking by Office; Thursday 4th -Monday 8th loading of entries;

Wednesday 10th, seeded programme.

Consideration was also given to the merits of moving the National Chionships to the end of June thus providing the proper 'climax' to the season and recognising the Age Group Championships as an appropriate preliminary event. Members did express some reservations in respect the academic year in Secondary Schools starting in June.

The Meeting agreed to recommend to Council that the Programme tabled the Director be amended to show the Scottish Age Group Championships

that recommendation being based upon support from the North, East ar Midland Districts (albeit with reservations on the part of the latter but with disagreement recorded on behalf of the West District.

- 8. Squad Training Arrangements
  The Director tabled a revised schedule of Weekends (see Appendix 3) to taccount of the major sports event being staged at Stirling University what caused the postponement of the planned Youth Squad Weekend from 7th/September to 5th/6th October.
  The revised schedule was approved.
- 9. National Seminar (31st August/ 1st September 1991)
  It was noted that there were no major problems or matters outstanding.
- 10. A.O.C.B.
  The following matters were noted:-
  - ( i) SSCA Letter
    The proposed criteria for selection would be considered at the next meeting of the Swimming Committee for inclusion in the 1992 Programme Guide.
  - (11) Masters Swimmers
    Mr. White sought clarification of the position of Masters swimmers who might be selected to swim for their club in league fixtures.

    It was noted that any Masters swimmer could compete in swimming competition provided that he/she was Registered in that category with the Association (ie as a Swimmer and not solely as a Masters swimmer).
- 11. Date of Next Meeting
  It was agreed that the next meeting of the Swimming Committee would be held on SUNDAY 29th SEPTEMBER at 10.30cm AT STIBLING UNIVERSITY.

Note of Meeting between SASA (Swimming Committee) Representatives and the Scottish Schools Swimming Association (SSSA) held on Wednesday 4th September 1991 at 29 Hartington Place, Edinburgh.

### 1. 1992 Strasbourg School Games

Mr. Raeburn outlined the background to the Games and to the previous discussions between the Executives of the two Associations.

The Games had originally been proposed by the French as a celebration by the EC countries of 1992. In that context, representation at the Games would have been at GB level. Subsequently, the Games had developed beyond European boundaries and, consequently, opportunity had arisen for representation at Scottish rather than GB level.

On the last occasion when funding had been sought from the Scottish Sports Council, assistance (more generous than initially anticipated) had been received from the Sports Council via the SASA. However, there is no guarantee of similar provision on this (1992) occasion and the SSSA Executive Committee would not be happy to undertake 100% funding. In discussion with the SASA Executive, the potential of use of ESSO sponsorship funding had been mentioned.

Mr. Raeburn considered that the Gamos would be a very high level event, that the swimmers would benefit greatly from participation in what would be a multi-sport event, would also benefit from the social interaction with local schools/ community and proposed that the whole venture would be handled jointly between the two Associations.

### 2. SASA (Swimming Committee) Rosponse

Mr. Brown identified the funding element of the proposition as being a major problem for two main reasons. First, on behalf of the SASA Swimming Committee, he felt that it would be difficult to justify allocation of scarce funds for this proposition as a priority over, for example, the need to raise funds for Commonwealth Games preparation - further, to remove funds from the 'core programme' for that purpose would be to reduce opportunity for others within that programme. Second, as stated to the National Staff Seminar on Saturday 31st August, he could not guarantee any part of the SASA National Programme for 1992 until budget approval had been given by the Treasurer - such approval was in doubt because of the funding of the Association (SASA) and because the recession was causing major sponsors to review their entire sponsorship programmes.

Mr. Smith identified a further problem; the date of the Games (first week in July 1992) conflicted with that of the SASA National Championships although some doubt was expressed by Mr. Raeburn about the actual dates of swimming competition at the Games. The National Championships were a 'required competition' for SASA National Squad Swimmors and were important to the selection process of swimmers for the 1992/93 season.

It was recognised that there would be major problems associated with this proposition for the Games of 1992.

### 3. Longer-term co-operation

In general discussion, it was noted that the development of International Swimming at Schools level could result in major European and World Meets every three out of four years. This represented a significant development for the SSSA and clearly raised many issues in respect of the relevant roles of the two Associations.

It was also noted that such competition would have significant funding implications and that the SSSA was, in effect, far better placed in respect of existing funding and in the generation of new funds.

Equally, it was recognised that wherever possible the two Associations should be working together to the mutual benefit of Swimming. Mr. Sminoted, with regret, that University level swimming in the U.K. had little connections with the National Bodies.

### 4. Conclusions

The Meeting determined to recommend to the respective Associations that a 'technical working party' be established to....

- ( i)...identify the respective constituencies;
- ( ii) ... identify the areas of common ground and the areas of mutual interest;
- ( iv)...make recommendations to the Executive Committees of the two Associations.

#### Joint Meeting between the Commonwealth Games Council for REPORT Scotland and the Scottish Sports Council held on Thursday 12th September 1991 at Gyle, Edinburgh.

The Association had been invited to send two Delegates (Mr. Black and Mr. H.H. Smith) to this Neeting. The Swimming Convener attended solely as an observer.

Introduction

The Neeting opened with statements of intent from representatives of both Councils.

On the part of the Commonwealth Games Council, Mr. Webster gave clear notice of the intention to plan early, to consult widely and to be open to The support of the Sports Council was much appreciated. suggestions. On behalf of the Scottish Sports Council, Mr. Portoous outlined their suppor for the Games effort through :-

a) their intention to support extra training and competition with extra finance ;

b) their support for sports science testing and for use of their sports medicine facilities ;

c) their intention to make more of their own staff available to

assist where appropriate;

d) their intention to press Government on the grounds that Commonwealth Games should be regarded as a priority over all four years (seeking some £100,000 each year) ; this being consistent with existing policy of shifting funding towards excellence.

e) their support for the proposal to start early by getting the Technical Committee underway immediately and by the appointment of managers/

coaches as soon as possible.

2. Selection Timetable

Within a broad suggested framework of team selection by 1st June 1994 and likely departure for Canada on 8th August, the matter was remitted to the Technical Committee to consider potentially phased approaches to the selecti process and to the provision of support services.

3. Press Liaison

Mr. Webster noted the improved relationship between the Games Council and th Press due to a far more open approach being adopted. However, in order to protect Associations it was suggested that all announcements relating to the Games should be made through their officer (Gordon Casely).

procedures and to establish a Plan ... Games Countdown !!

4. Finance & Fundraising

In addition to consideration of a 'Sponsorship Prospectus' for the Games, Mr. Porteous noted potential support for Governing Bodies with good plans over a 3-4 year follow-through cycle. Letters had already been sent to local authorities asking them to support through sponsorship potential team members within their area. The Director of Swimming identified the need for consideration of 'athlete support'.

2. Lactate Testing Report (April to August 1991) Dr. Howat summarised his formal Report (see attached) by noting that there had been little change over the period. This was a very disappointing result as change would have been anticipated over a period leading to major Championships. The test results showed that aerobic capacity had not improved\_ over the period and that anaerobic capacity was poor - both being relatively poor in comparison to known levels achieved by swimmers of major swimming nations.

3. Assessment

Clearly, training programmes are not as effective as necessary to achieve the highest levels of competitive performance. It was therefore determined to progress the situation as follows :-

( i) Drs Howat and Robson will combine to produce comparisons (cases not named) as examples to show the coaches of Wave Programme swimmers;
