(3) From Report (Olympic Games Trials Organisation)

Covering letter and Page 2 Item 4.1/4.1.2. :-SASA Director of Swimming : The Report from Mr. Stubbs accurately describes the events leading towards the meeting of 8th January 1992. The ASFGB STC was concerned that there is no GB structure capable of organising the Trials and members were not prepared to accept a second rate organisation at local

The Meeting of 8th January 1992 has recommended that Mr. Stubbs and Mr. Smit as part of their GB funded duties, undertake the steering roles. The reques amounts to recognition of a workload equivalent to a day per week through to the Trials in May.

I suggest that the following points may be of interest to Council in making a decision on this matter :-

As Chairman of the ASKGB STC, I can vouch for the importance placed by that Committee on the achievement of a high standard of organisation of the Olympic Trials. That unanimous view was reache taking account of our obligations to the competitors, the need to attract television and sponsorship to offset costs and the need for the longer term in promoting public interest in Swimming, Diving and Synchronised Swimming.

There is no GB organisation capable of staging the event. In that (ii) context it is relevant to note the importance placed by the Scottis Sports Council on all sports participating in the organisation and management of our sports at (ill level - they wish to see a strong Scottish influence. Also in that context it is interesting to note the intention to create an English Sports Council and to introduce a new body with responsibility (including funding) for GB level It would appear to be to our potential longer-term activities. advantage to be seen to be co-operating with and influencing GB events such as the Olympic Trials.

While recognising that the Association may be faced with difficulties due to the non-availability of the Director of Swimming on a day-per-week equivalent between now and the Trials, I would recommend that the proposal be supported on the basis of the longer-term interests of the Association.

ORGANISATION OF THE OLYMPIC TRIALS

- 1. At a meeting of the ASFGB Technical Swimming Committee held at Coventry on 5th September 1991 it was recommended that a Management Committee to organise the Trials should be formed by the 1993 European Championships O.C. in consultation with the GB TSC and the NECASA.
- 2. This was examined again at the meeting held 14th December at Barnet. It was agreed that the European Championships Organising Committee would not be in a position to greatly assist in the organisation of the Trials and other methods were considered. Two courses of action were agreed upon:
 - 2.1 That the TSC meet the Honorary Secretary of the NECASA Management Committee to discuss and recommend an Organising Committee for the Trials.
 - 2.2 That the Directors of Swimming for England and Scotland should invite Mr. H. Bland and others to discuss the special needs of the Trials and to discuss ideas and suggestions made at the TSC meeting.
- 3. The meeting with the Honorary Secretary of the NECASA M.C., Mr.Malcolm Hill, was duly arranged for Sunday 15th December at Barnet. Present at the meeting were:

4.1 From this meeting it was agreed that the Directors of Swimming for England and Scotland should be responsible for the organisation of the Trials and that the two Associations be asked to include this in the work loads of the respective Directors. It was pointed out that the ASFGB did make a grant each year to the ASA and SASA for the services of the two Directors when working on GB projects and that any time spent organising the Trials should be part of this arrangement. In this connection it was agreed that:

- 4.1.1 Mr. Bland would present the request to the ASA Management Committee at its meeting 17/18 January
- 4.1.2 Mr. Bush agreed to discuss this request with Mr. D. Brown and ask him to present it to the SASA

The group discussed several aspects of the event as requested and attempted to include approximate estimates as each point was debated.

4.2 Presentation of the Trials

It was agreed that something extra was needed to give the event the necessary atmosphere so essential for excellent performances. These were the Olympic Trials and we should emphasise 'Olympism' and present it as an Olympic event, we needed to 'Hype the Event'. Points discussed included:

Opening Ceremony

Presentation of personalities including previous Olympic Medal Winners

Live Music

Pool Dressing

Special Presentation of Winners

Hospitality Suite - VIP's, Coaches, Technical Officials Interviews

Appoint a presenter for the Finals - Mr. Bland agreed to assist in this capacity

4.3 Advertising

Recommended that the Trials be advertised more extensively than recent events, this would include:

Swimming Times - adverts Feb, March, April plus editorials Swimmer - adverts plus editorial

Flysheet to be included with 'Grapevine'

Posters - all pools

- local schools etc

Liaison with Sheffield, especially schools Flysheet sent to all coaches and teachers throughout ST and BSCA channels

Consideration be given to advertising on local radio Advertising to be discussed with Sheffield officials

4.4 Sales

Recommended that special Tee Shirts etc be produced - Mr. Hill to prepare details of these and other items.

4.5 Sponsorahip

Burtons Biscuits had indicated that they would not be sponsoring the Trials and Mr. Stubbs was asked to liaise with Mr. Peter Roberts on this question.

4.6 Programme

Recommended that a good quality souvenir programme be produced and that it be ready for sale at least a week before the event. Mr. Stubbs to liaise with Mr. Hassall on this point. The layout of the programme and adverts was discussed and it was agreed to discuss these with Mr. Hassall.

4.7 Entry Fees

Recommended that the straight £5.00 per entry suggested by the GB TSC be amended to £5.00 for first entry and £3.00 for subsequent entries.

1. Minutes of the Meeting of 29th September 1991

The Minutes of the Meeting of 29th September 1991 were approved without amendment on a motion proposed by Mr. White and seconded by Mr. Davidson.

2. Minutes of the Meeting of 10th November 1991

The Minutes of the Meeting of 10th November 1991 were approved on a motion proposed by Mr. Lochray and seconded by Mr. Dashwood-Brady subject to the undernoted amendment:-

Page 1: Item 2 (iii): Line 4

Delete the last word in that line : 'soon'.

3. Matters Arising (from 29th September)

Page 1: World Cup Final

The Director of Swimming reported that no response had yet been received from Canada either in terms of the results or the prize money.

: Working Group : Computer Provisions

Mr. Lochray and Mr. Dashwood-Brady reported that no formal meeting had taken place. The Convener suggested that early identification of the needs for Swimming would be of assistance - the National Sprint Championships had demonstrated the need for 'on line results'. Various lines of enquiry were noted and it was agreed that once the Swimming requirements had been identified, the broader needs of the Association should be added to try to build a coherent package of which the meet modules would be part.

Page 2: Annual Programme Guide

The Director reported that the times had been completed and were already included in the Guide which is currently being printed. Members expressed regret that the times had not been circulated for consideration prior to being published. In subsequent discussion, the Director advised that circulation of the times had been sought through Mr. Barnett but that this had not been carried out.

ACTION: CONVENER TO WRITE TO MR. BARNETT ASKING THAT THOSE TIMES BE CIRCULATED IMMEDIATELY TO ALL MEMBERS OF THE SWIMMING COMMITTEE.

Page 3: Potential Sponsor

The Director of Swimming confirmed that he had made contact as arranged through The Council House: unfortunately, the potential sponsor was not really interested in the Association and only mildly interested in the Olympic connection (Spain) with his sea-food business. There was no further development possible and Miss Carberry had been advised to that effect.

: Invitation to Mr. Raeburn

The Convener explained that he had understood that negotiations/discussions between the Schools Association and the SASA over the Awards Scheme are continuing: he had considered it to be less than desirable to risk confusing those issues with the Swimming Committee business of potential

Page 4: Budget Update

The Convener and the Director of Swimming advised the Meeting that no information had been received on the current state of expenditure of Swimming Committee allocations (either on Core or Wave Programme). The Meeting expressed concern that it is impossible for the Committee to undertake its functions unless the situation is clearly defined - the Committee must be able to plan for meets in December (ASA Winter Championships - Wave Funding) and January/February/ March 1992 (Meets as identified from the Core Funding and Wave Funding) - those selections being due immediately following the Scottish Winter Championships at Ayr.

: Submission to the Sports Council

The Director outlined the proposed basis of the submission and sought the views of the Committee on several matters:-

i) Wave Programme: the Committee took the view that the submission to the Sports Council should be adjusted to £35,000 for the year.

(ii) East Kilbride: discussions had already taken place between the Director and representatives of the District Council. The support of the Association would be important in the bid for funding from the Foundation for Sport and the Arts potentially for some £75,000: it is equally important that recognition of East Kilbride as a centre of excellence for Swimming gains some rights of access for the Association. The Committee supported the basis of application.

(iii) Glasgow (50m Pool): it was noted that Glasgow District Council are seeking the support of the Association for funding applications. Members considered the potential difficulties in supporting both applications but took the view that support for East Kilbride as already promised should be followed-through: the Association could legitimately also support the application by Glasgow in terms of the provision of a pool capable of housing International level competition.

Page 8: Nominations for Awards

It was noted that the Council had already determined the awards based on the nominations of the Swimming Committee.

Additional : Jack Queen Study Group

It was noted that the first Report would be received by Council in the near future. The Council would determine what actions would be taken (eg round-table discussion) thereafter.

- 4. Matters Arising (from 10th November)
 (Referred to Agenda Item: Report on Esso Sponsorship Meeting)
- 5/6. Correspondence
 From the lists of Correspondence circulated and the updated list tabled, the following items were considered:-

91.444: Inter-District Contest 1991
It was noted that the East District had not as yet received the medals for their Junior Team.

91.446: Training Weekends

It was noted that difficulties had been experienced during Training Weeken at Stirling in respect of facility bookings. The Director of Swimming advised that the problem centred on lack of communication between the SASA Office and the University - existing bookings were not being checked confirmed with the University on a weekly basis as previously operated.

ACTION: CONVENER TO WRITE TO MR. BLACK TO ADVISE OF THE PROBLEMS AND TO

91.448: Commonwealth Swimming Records
Members asked that copies of the current records be circulated to all
Members.
ACTION: SWIMMING CONVENER TO CIRCULATE RECORDS

91.481: Carlyn Connaghan

The Convener advised that he had intervened to deal with a problem where Carlyn's employers were not allowing her time to train/compete as necessary in terms of her potential. The Director of Swimming had responded but there had been communication problems. The Director of Swimming undertook to advise the employer of Carlyn's programme from January 1992 onwards.

91.519: Open Meeting: Scottish Sports Association (9th January 1992)
In view of the fact that the proposed Open Meeting covered issues arising from the Report, Coaching Matters, the Meeting recommended that the Association invite the Scottish Swimming Coaches Association to send a representative to that meeting.

7. Reports to Committee

a) Report (Swimming Convener) to SASA Council (6th October 1991)

Members accepted the Report. It was noted in respect of Item 3(f) that Esso had no objection to the 19/24 Age Group participating in the SASA Esso National Age Group Championships. Members welcomed that clarification.

b) Proposed (by Swimming Convener) Swimming Committee Budget 1991/92

Members noted that the budget proposed by the Convener was for less than that actually allocated in 1990/91. The error had occurred because of the £5,000 repayment for the 1990 Commonwealth Games: the Convener was asked to write to Mr. Charles to propose that the budget for 1991/92 be increased by £5,000.

ACTION: CONVENER TO WRITE TO MR. CHARLES REGARDING ADJUSTMENT TO THE

ACTION: CONVENER TO WRITE TO MR. CHARLES REGARDING ADJUSTMENT TO THE BUDGET PROPOSALS SUBMITTED.

Mr. Lochray questioned a payment recorded to Mr. Wallace. The Convener advised that, thanks to the efforts of Mr. Charles, some information on the actual expenditure details was now being received by Conveners. However, the accuracy of some of that information was questionable - the Convener was taking the view that the information provided was the best available and had recorded costs under existing headings - however, those individual headings should not all be taken to be accurate.

The Director of Swimming proposed that selected (on 8th December 1991) swimmers from the Wave Programme (+ 2 juniors) be subsidised to attend the ASA Winter Championships at Barnet on 13th-15th December. The Committee agreed to support application to the Treasurer for 10 swimmers and 3 coaches to a maximum sum of £1,500 total. In response to the Convener, the Director of Swimming agreed to contact those potential members to advise of the provisional arrangements which would be confirmed or cancelled on 8th December.

ACTION: CONVENER TO WRITE TO MR. CHARLES REGARDING APPROVAL TO SPEND TO A MAXIMUM OF £1,500 FROM THE WAVE PROGRAMME ALLOCATION.

c) Report (Swimming Convener): S.S.A. Annual Conference
Members accepted the Report and regretted that wider representation of the
Association had not been in attendance.

d) Report (Swimming Convener) to SASA Council (24th November)

The Meeting accepted the Report. In discussion on the matters brought to the attention of Council, the following points were noted:-

3 (i)(ii): Nominations
It was reported that the Council had deferred a decision until
later in 1992. The existing representatives on the Commonwealth
Games/Sports Council working groups (eg The Director of Swimming,
Mr. McGowan and the Convener) would continue to deal with the
business of those groups.

: The Convener expressed concern that the Association meet the requests for information/proposals (eg Selections and Procedures) otherwise decisions may be imposed on the Association.

It was agreed to recommend to Council that the representatives

to SASA Executive approval; that those responses be lodged with the Scottish Commonwealth Games Council Secretary prior to the next scheduled Meeting of 28th January 1992.

- e) Report (Swimming Convener): Commonwealth Games Council Meeting (14th Nov) The Meeting accepted the Report and noted the deadlines for submissions as requested by the Commonwealth Games Council and the Sports Council.
- f) SSA Paper: Performance and Excellence

The Director of Swimming asked the Convener to explain the origins of the Paper. The Convener advised that the Paper had been circulated by the Scottish Sports Association to all member Governing Bodies; their Annual Conference in October 1991 had identified key questions which had been addressed by the visiting speakers and by the delegates resulting in an outline series of points which were presented in the Paper. The ultimate objective is to identify a 'National Strategy for Performance and Excellence' to serve as a guideline and as a model for lobbying purposes.

The Director of Swimming indicated that, in his opinion, any such document is of relatively little value unless the end function(s) are clearly defined. g) Outcome of Sponsorship Proposals to ESSO

It was noted that neither Mr. Lochray nor Mr. White had received their copies of the SASA proposals to ESSO.

ACTION : CONVENER TO WRITE TO MR. BARNETT TO ESTABLISH WHY TWO MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE HAD NOT DECEIVED A COPY AND TO ASK THAT THIS BE RECTIFIED IMMEDIATELY.

The Director of Swimming reported on the meeting with ESSO and advised that the outcome (not yet confirmed in writing) is as follows :-

- (a) ESSO National Squads (1992)..... £15,500
- (b) ESSO contribution to District Squads for 1992..... £ 1,000 £16,500
- (c) Willingness to consider sponsorship of the 1993 Multinations Meet provided that there is TV coverage.

Members considered the implications of the award. There was disappointment that the company had not extended their support for the District level programme, concern that the overall level of the sponsorship had diminished and relief that the company had nevertheless seen fit to make a major contribution to the work of the Association. In detailed discussion on the matters arising, the following points were noted :-

(i) January to June 1992

The proposals to remain with the existing Squads and to complete the current programme were endorsed.

(ii) July 1992 to December 1992

That the revisions to the Squads as proposed to ESSO would take place The programme identified in outline for the District Squads in July. would be funded from the £1,000 (ESSO) and from increased revenue from entries to National Championships which would be proposed to the Council for Fees for 1992 (£3.00 for Individual Events; £5.00 for Relay Events) and minor adjustments to give an overall total of some £4,000.

(iii) January 1992 That the Director of Swimming and the Convener would combine to produce a discussion document / proposal for consideration by the Committee and by Districts on the detail of operation of the District Squads and

the programme of competition.

It should be noted that members felt that the document should be produced immediately: while recognising the desirability of that timing, the Convener advised that it would be a physical impossibility.

There was further discussion on the issue of fund-raising with some members expressing the view that if the existing fund-raising mechanism within the Association cannot deliver then the appointment of an effective agency must be The Convener agreed to note that view but expressed concern that the Committee representatives (eg Convener/ Director of Swimming) cannot be expected to undertake all the support work necessary even for an agency - and

The Meeting also identified that the major frustration is the late notification of the sum actually available for expenditure in 1992. At this point (December 1991) bookings must be confirmed and commitments made yet there is no positive indication of actual funding. In that context it was agreed that the Committee recommend to the Treasurer that consideration be given to submission by the disciplines of their 1993 requests in May 1992 in the hope that the 1993 allocation can be known in September /October 1992.

8. Nominations for SASA Awards

It was noted that the business under this heading had been completed under Matters Arising.

9. Proposed Changes to Rules (SASA AGM February 1992)
The previously considered proposals had been drafted by the Convener and were contained in the Paper (Item 9).

Members noted that ESSO had no objection to the 19/24 Age Group participating in the National Age Group Championships. However, on a majority view, it was decided that the 'enabling clause' proposed should remain: however, it was emphasised that there was no intention to remove that age group from the Championships in the immediate future.

In discussion on the proposed changes to the Inter-District Contest, members noted that the 1992 Inter-District Contest could usefully serve as a stepping stone towards the 1993 Contest which would take place in April of that year within the District Squad structure.

The Meeting supported the proposed Changes to Rules as Grafted and instructed the Convener to submit those changes to the SASA AGM in February 1992.

ACTION: CONVENER TO SUBMIT THE CHANGES TO RULES ON BEHALF OF THE SWIMMING COMMITTEE.

10. A.O.C.B.

The following items were noted :-

(i) Withdrawals from Squads

The Director of Swimming advised that Ross Murray, David Gammie and Shona Smart had all notified their withdrawal from the National Squads.

(ii) Squad /Team Staffing
Members noted that one member of the National Squad Staff had been unable,
for a variety of reasons, to undertake Squad Weekend Training. Under the
circumstances it was agreed that that member should not be eligible for
Team Selection in 1992 and the Director of Swimming was asked to explain
to that member that participation in 1992/93 would not be effected by this
decision so long as participation in the Squad Weekends was undertaken.

(iii) Sponsorship for the Senior Squad
Members noted that the procurement of sponsorship for that Squad is
an important matter which should be tackled as soon as possible.

(iv) National Sprint Championships 1991

Members recorded differing views on the Championships held on the previous day at Dunfermline: those view included the following:

(a) That it had been a successful event, with good TV coverage on BBC TV Sportscene on Saturday 10.15pm.

(b) That there had been some organisational problems - eg lack of start sheets for the finals session - lack of clarity regarding the semi final seedings. It was noted that a 'manual' would help future organising committees.

(c) The operation of the swim-offs was criticised for interrupting the warm-up; the advance start (5 minutes early for the evening session) was also criticised.

(d) The operation of the event as an age-group contest was suggested but rejected.

- (e) The Convener noted that he had introduced some 11 additional heats from the number accepted in 1990: the Meeting considered that the number of heats was not a problem but felt that the pace of operation could have been closer to the target times if two sets of officials had been used.
- (f) There was a general feeling that the commentary did not link the activities and consequently that the event did not 'flow' as well as it might have done.
- (g) The Convener drew the attention of the Committee to the fact that the Ranked Lists and the Seeded Lists had been lodged with the Association Office by Recorded Delivery Post on 19th November (posted Monday 18th and arrival on 19th verified with the Office). A memo from the Convener with the Lists confirmed the previous request that the ranked list be copied and sent out immediately to all Clubs to advise them of accepted entries, reserves and (by deduction) of rejected entries.

The Convener was not advised by the Office of any problem with that arrangement and was unaware of any problem until Sunday 24th November when Club representatives called to request information.

On Monday 25th November the Convener contacted Mr. Barnett to be advise that the Lists were only going into the post on that day - five to six days later than arranged.

The Meeting deplored the failure on the part of the Office to meet the commitment when many others (eg Mrs. Brockie, Mrs. McDougall) had worked long and hard to prepare the Lists.

ACTION: CONVENER TO WRITE TO MR. BLACK TO ADVISE HIM OF THE SITUATION AND TO ASK HIM TO INVESTIGATE WHY A LEGITIMATE AND IMPORTANT REQUEST AND FUNCTION HAD BEEN IGNORED TO THE DETRIMENT OF CLUBS AND INDIVIDUALS.

Page 2: Budget Update

I would be grateful if you could advise me by Friday 6th December of the availability of funds for the Swimming activities planned for the period January to April 1992. This information is required for selection purposes and to enable the Committee at the meeting of 8th December to finalise all necessary arrangements (Core Programme).

- Page 3: The Committee has also agreed to support 10 swimmers and three staff to attend the ASA Winter Championships in Barnet (13th-15th December) to a total of £1,500 from Wave Programme Funding please advise me of the availability of funds to cover (even on a temporary basis until 1992 Wave Funding becomes available or from any 1991 underspend).
- Page 3: Adjustment to Budget Proposals 1991/92

 The Swimming Committee noted that I had incorrectly discounted the £5,000 paid back by the Committee in 1990/91. As there is no further pay-back requirement in 1991/92 that sum (£5,000) should be restored to provide the 1990/91 level of expenditure actually approved.

 I have therefore asked the Director of Swimming, subject to your agreement, to revise the 8 Nations Contest allocation because the expenses will be higher than normal for that event.
- Page 5: Submission Date for Estimates
 The Committee suggests that the date for submission of discipline estimates be advanced to May in the hope that actual allocations for the following years can be known by September/October: this would facilitate planning and necessary commitments (eg travel- at cheaper rates).

1.1 Paisley 500 Trophy

The Convener noted that the National Winter Championships Programme suggested that the sole criterion for the award of the Trophy is the points associated with a particular swim.

As the Committee agreed that the information given was incorrect, it was agreed that the Convener should discuss the matter with Mr. Craig (Convener, Organising Committee) and arrange for a statement to be broadcast by the announcer, advising that the award was based on several factors including points.

It was agreed that Committee members would meet near the Recorders' Table at the start of the relays in the final session to agree the nominee for the award.

1.2 Finance

The Convener had circulated the response from Mr. Charles (Treasurer) to the questions raised at the previous Meeting (1st December).

While there were matters contained within that response which must be the subject of further discussion or correspondence, the key issue at present related to the conditions under which the Committee could proceed with the programme of events planned for December 1991 to March 1992. Effectively, the Treasurer had indicated that those events could be undertaken but that, in the event of a shortfall in the anticipated funding of the Association (eg Sports Council grants) then cuts would have to be made at a later stage in the programme.

Members agreed to proceed and to accept the potential implications of that decision It was agreed that the Convener should write to Mr. Charles in respect of the other issues arising.

1.3 Meets/Selections

It was noted that the following Meets would be considered for selection purposes at the evening Meeting:-

- (i) ASA National Winter Championships (Barnet) (12-15 December)
 10 + 3 to a total cost not to exceed £1500: nominations required from the Director of Swimming.
- (ii) Leicester (World Cup) : (16-19 January)

24 + 6 to a total cost of £3,600 and a net cost of £3,000

- (iii) World Cup (Malmo 20-23 Jan, Bonn 23-27 Jan, Milan 27-30 Jan, Paris 30-3 Feb Funding from the Wave Programme.
- (iv) Ulster Games: (13-16 March)

20 + 4 to a total cost of £4,000 and a net cost of £3,500.

It was noted that this is a 'best team' selection but excluding any swimmers selected to compete at World Cup Meets.

v) Viareggio: (13-17 February)

14 + 4 to a total cost of £5630 and a net cost of £5000.

It was noted that the selections would be based on 1977 but with 1976 and 1978 possibles.

1.4 Matters Raised

In general discussion on the above matters, the following issues were raised and considered:-

(i) <u>Ulster</u>: concern was expressed regarding the reported increase in political and terrorist activity. It was agreed to proceed to select the Team, to hold-back on the issue of notice of selection until late January (with the exception of staff), to monitor the situation in terms of safety and to

those selected could, without prejudice to future selections, withdraw if they or their parents were unhappy about the prospect of being in Northern Ireland.

(ii) Non-attenders: it was noted that Anna Gray, Angela Pendrich, Graeme Smith and Neil Arthur had not attended the Championships and, in some cases, had not attended set training weekends.

In the case of Anna Gray, illness had been notified and it was therefore determined that she should be eligible for selection assuming a return to full fitness.

In the cases of the other three swimmers, no explanations or reasonable excuse had been notified. Consequently, the Committee decided that they would not be eligible for selection and should receive a letter stating the reasons for non-selection; that letter should also make it clear that should they fulil their obligations on future occasions then they will again become eligible for selection.

(iii) Younger Swimmers: there was considerable discussion on the highly creditable progress of some younger swimmers such as Nicola Steel and Katie Burke. Although on the edge of selection for World Cup events, it was felt that their longer term interests would be better served by more gradual and less pressurised progress in competition terms.
