IAN RUSSELL ON THE MEND





The equipment will be installed at the Carnegie Centre and will be available to others using the Centre.


In the Game of Water Polo, as with many modern sports, the awareness of time can prove crucial to matches and the provision of display timing is of major importance in the development of players of all ages but especially for the younger players.

The current score, period of play, match, possession and penalty times are shown which will also greatly enhance the enjoyment of all spectators watching the game.




The timing equipment purchased from Epsan Sports in Holland as there is no British made equivalent, has been delivered and tested, the Club officials found it very easy to operate - it is pre-programmed for the whole match set up, including intervals.

The equipment was formally handed over to the Carnegie Centre and Graeme Malcolm President of the Club, by Dr Fraser of the Trust on Tuesday 23 November 1993.

Structure for the Development of Performance in Swimming in Great Britain

NATIONAL COACHING FOUNDATION - COACH EDUCATION PROGRAMME
