SCOTTISH SWIMMING

Following presentations by the Association to both the Operations Division and the full Scottish Sports Council record grant aid has been awarded to the SASA.

For financial year 1995 the Association has been awarded £163,000 towards the implementation of its development plan. A provisional award of £672,000 has been made for the four year period of the plan 1995 - 98. This is subject to the Association making the necessary progress with its various detailed projects and financial plans.

Chairman Ian Mason was delighted by the outcome of the Association's submissions - "This is a vital ingredient in place in successfully implementing our development plan. 1995 will be the start of the implementation process against which we will be measured. Everyone involved in Scottish Swimming has an important role in moving our sport forward"

Board of Management, Committees and professional staff are currently putting further detail on the various project plans.

NATIONAL SERVICE TO SPORT AWARDS 1994



At a luncheon in the Scandic Crown Hotel in Edinburgh last month the Scottish Sports Council presented five awards. Bill Black, Swimming, Mike Fitchett, Squash, Kathleen McNeil MBE, Golf, David Webster, Commonwealth Games Council and Duncan Winning, Canoeing. The presentations were made by Sir Peter Heatly.

Chairman of the Scottish Sports Council Graeme M. Simmers said in his introduction " Throughout the world of sport the smooth and effective running of governing bodies is usually down to the dedication of countless volunteers. Often their efforts go unrecognised and unrewarded.

The National Service to Sport Awards were introduced by the Scottish Sports Council in 1990. These aim to recognise those who have or are

making an outstanding contribution in a voluntary capacity to Scottish sport at a national level. The five winners all exhibit certain special qualities and have been involved at a level well beyond that demanded of them in terms of their official designations."

Bill Black's citation mentioned some of the activities that he has been involved in since joining Clydebank Amateur Swimming Club in 1946. It states that he has made a major contribution to the development of swimming in Scotland. He was elected General Secretary in 1973 and served with the exception of one year until 1994, when the post was discontinued in the re-structuring. Bill also received the FINA Silver Pin in 1994 for his service to Swimming. He has been a member of the Great Britain Committee since 1973.

THE BRITISH SWIMMING COACHES ASSOCIATION ANNUAL CONFERENCE 1995

The British Swimming Coaches Association's 1995 Annual Conference was held at Haydock Thistle Hotel, Merseyside on 6 - 8 January 1995. There were over 120 residential delegates and many more who attended individual lectures.

I was a little disappointed that the only delegates from north of the border were Briony Shimmons and myself, as well as Martyn Woodroffe who made a good presentation as part of the Directors' Forum.

The main guest speaker was Chris Martin, Head Coach at the University of Florida. To me he was a typical American coach, with wild enthusiasm, bags of ambition and the sort of facilities that most of us can only dream about. He made presentations about freestyle, breaststroke, backstroke and team organisation. Although I felt that there was nothing startlingly new (having listened to his mentor, Richard Shouldberg, twice in recent years), it was good to hear somebody who had coached Olympic Champions tell us what he does. There were a lot of interesting tid bits and ideas to use, however, I did find myself thinking that we are blessed with lots of talented coaches in Scotland, but the only difference is access to facilities and the differing attitude to education and sport.

It was great to hear Dave Calleja (Stockport Metro) - coach to Graeme Smith. He stated at the beginning of his presentation that he was a bit fed up of going to conferences and seminars and hearing people telling us what they think we need to know. Therefore, he was going to tell us what he does!

Dave displayed as much enthusiasm and knowledge as Chris Martin and the overwhelming impression I got was that he has fought very hard to provide his swimmers with the best environment possible in Stockport. Dave is coming to Scotland in March (see separate advert) to make two pres-

entations:

- 1) Preparation of Elite Swimmer and
- 2) The Development of Youth Swimming.

If you want to know what he does and what he thinks you CAN DO, then do not miss it. On the Sunday afternoon there will be an opportunity to spend two hours with Dave, Dougie Campbell and four other top Scottish Coaches to brainstorm! Do not miss that opportunity!!

Back to Haydock.

There were some lively debates about:

- the use of creatine supplements
- English National Age Group qualifying times
- drug abuse by the Chinese

Grant Robbins (former GB International, Portsmouth Northsea) related his experiences in Portsmouth, Australia and Canada, again making us all feel jealous about the opportunities that are available to athletes in other countries. However, as I stated before our coaches are just as talented, committed and enthusiastic and with the developments that are being made in Scotland currently, there is no reason why our swimmers cannot succeed in the future. New facilities are being created, finance is being made available to appoint full-time coaches and development officers, bursaries are being granted to full-time students, an elite funding programme is being etc etc. My hope is that it will not be long before a Scottish Olympic Swimmer will be asked to make a presentation at the BSCA Conference, because the rest of Britain want to know what we are doing.

Mike Peyrebrune (former Scottish Commonwealth Games representative) joined Don McLaren, Carl Payton, Dr David Hunt and Dr David Fadden to present a review of their trip to Atlanta for the International Symposium of Biomechanics and

Medicine in Swimming. If you want more details about the Symposium ask Alan Lynn he was also there!

As I mentioned before, Martyn joined Bryn Williams (Wales) and Paul Bush (England) to let us have a Director's view of the way swimming is developing in each of the home countries. The ensuing debate focused on the appointment of a GB Technical Director of Performance and whether or not an appointment had been made! there was no conclusive answer, but I feel that there will be an announcement soon. Keep your ear to the groove.

All in all I felt the trip was extremely worthwhile and I can only re-iterate that I believe that more Scottish coaches should join the BSCA and attend the conference!

SCOTTISH SPORTS COUNCIL FUNDING AGREED FOR INVERNESS

The planned new Ness Islands Aquadrome Centre has received a boost with publication of SSC funding of £100,000 towards the new 8 lane 25m pool and leisure centre. An exciting innovative design for both competitive and leisure swimming is expected to be in place in 1997. The SASA is currently involved in negotiating national and District access

NATIONAL TEAM HEAD FOR LANZAROTE

Some 20 swimmers head for sunny Lanzarote in March.

Following the 1994 Winter Championships in Ayr the 8 Nations Team was selected for this major contest. The contest will be held at the Royal Commonwealth Pool in Edinburgh on the 15th - 16th April. As part of the National Team Plan a two week training camp is being held prior to participating in Edinburgh. This is the first of a series of two training camps per year for the next four years as part of the build up to the 1998 Commonwealth Games.



II WORLD SHORT COURSE SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIPS

The second World Short Course Championships are to be held on the famous Copacabana Beach Pool in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. The meet is scheduled for the 30th November to 3rd December 1995.

National Federations have until the 30th April to nominate Starters and Technical Officials who wish to be considered for this event.

OLYMPIC GAMES ATLANTA 1996

The construction of the new Aquatics Centre is reported to be on schedule for completion in time for the various pre-Olympic meets - mainly FINA World Cup events which will take place in August this year.

The facility includes a swimming pool, a diving pool and a 15,000 seat shaded stadium. There will also be a temporary pool for water polo with 4,000 temporary spectator seats.

CARNEGIE TRIUMPHS AT STIRLING JUNIOR OPEN

A truly magnificent display by Carnegie swimmers at the Stirling Junior Open Meet on Saturday/Sunday 28th/29th January saw them win seven trophies out of eleven. The girls 12 and under age group saw the emergence of Sarah Kinnell despite being disqualified for taking her waterfilled goggles off during the fly leg and winning out of sight. Sarah went on to win three golds, one silver and a bronze and share the overall top 12year old award.

The girls 13years age group saw sister Lynda Kinnell win four golds and two bronzes and take top overall 13year old with clubmate Kirsten Sinclair winning a silver.

The boys 13years age group had Andrew Stewart win a bronze whilst the girls 14years age group was completely dominated by Carnegie swimmers. Scottish Youth Internationalist Lynn McLaren winning five golds and a silver setting two meet records in the 100m breaststroke in a time of 1:16.81 to win the Ian Black Trophy and also set a good meet record in the 200m Individual Medley in a time of 2:30.71. Lynn went on to take the overall 14year old age group Trophy. Meanwhile clubmate Jillian Rees in the same age group won a gold and four silvers to take runner-up in the overall. The same age group also saw Sarah Nicholson win a bronze and make two other grand finals and Jill Stirling make three finals. John Galloway had a magnificent swim in the 14years 100m Breaststroke to win the gold and equal the meet record held by Anglo Scot Steven Preston in a time of 1:12.09 seconds. John also made three other finals with team mate George Philips making two finals. The boys 15years age group saw Scottish Youth Internationalist Bryan Morgan set a very good meet record in the 100m Backstroke in a time of 1:00.86 to win gold also winning gold in the 100m Butterfly and three silvers to take top overall 15 year old boy.

Other swimmers to make finals were Emma Kane, Alison Muller, Christine Chalmers, Michael Kane, James White and in the boys 12years age group Martin McLuckie winning a bronze in the 100m Butterfly. Altogether 65 finalists 17 gold, 10 silver, 6 Bronze, 5 meet records and best of all 66 personal best times. So early in the season asks the question what is to come?


